COMMENCEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

The Charity was established on 21st September 1988.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Radha Madhav Society (UK) is a non-profit, religious, educational & charitable organisation. It serves as the United Kingdom's affiliate of Jagadguru Kripalu Parishat, which is the worldwide mission of His Divine Excellency Bhakti Yoga Rasavatara Shri 1008 Jagadguru Shri Kripalu Ji Maharaj, the supreme acharya of this age. The JKP trusts aims to contribute to the material well-being of mankind by providing orphans, widows and other needy and deprived persons. The trust has established many educational institutions, charitable hospitals & regularly organises medical relief camps for the deprived and needy.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 2017

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

Discourses based on the wisdom of ancient Hindu scriptures were arranged in halls and temples of major cities within UK, and home 'Bhakti Yoga Sankeertans' were arranged and conducted by HH Dr. Bageeshwari Devi during the tour of the various cities in UK. All the major Hindu festivals were also celebrated either at the Society's main centre at 109 Edgehill Road Leicester, or at a Hindu temple or a devotee's residence. In addition there were some major public discourses such as the 'Miraculous Power of Divine Name' in Wembley, 'Guru Poornima' at Leeds Hindu Temple and 7 day series on 'How to attain peace and happiness' in Ilford that benefited the public at large.

The popular series of talks on Vedic scriptures by Jagadguru Kripaluji Maharaj have continued to be broadcast on Global television channels for the benefit of the community.

On July 29th 2016 President of Jagadguru Kripalu Parishat (JKP), Sushri Dr Vishakha Tripathi Ji, was honoured with the 'Indian Icon Award 2016' for her exemplary work in providing free education to young girls from the primary to postgraduate level. At the same time, Dr Tripathi was also praised for her philanthropic work in running 3 free hospitals in rural parts of UP each which have observed 300,000 patient visits each year. The prestigious award was selectively given to notable achievers, fifty in all, who have performed extraordinary services in a selfless and tireless manner. The Indian Icon Awards' is given by 'Time Indian News' to recognize and highlight individual and institutional achievements in influencing lives. Apart from achievers in India, awardees also include people of Indian origin from Singapore, Thailand and Dubai.

JKP Education, the educational wing of JKP, provides free education to over 4000 girls at Kripalu Balika Primary School, Kripalu Balika Intermediate College, and Kripalu Mahila Mahavidyalay located in Kunda, a small town in Pratapgarh district of Uttar Pradesh where girls lack opportunities and financial resources to study. To facilitate their education, it also provides free bicycles to students who live far from the school, free uniforms, school bags and related educational items.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The biggest spending was donation towards charitable trust established by Jagadguru Kripalu Parishat in India which not only helps the poor in the rural areas but also has established charitable hospitals and schools. About £385,000 was donated to worthy charitable causes.

The second major spent on broadcasting the spiritual talks based on Vedic scriptures by our Spiritual Founder Jagadguru Shri Kripaluji Maharaj on Aastha International TV. Like every year, finances were used for organising the above activities and for costs of Dr. Bageeshwari Devi's trips to UK, including transportation and subsistence during her stay in UK. Finally, there are the annual maintenance costs of Society's Edgehill Road property in Leicester that are financed by the society.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The two major sources of finances are the 'monthly donations' that have been setup as standing orders by devotees/members of the society and 'ad hoc donations'. Members of the society generously pledged and donated towards our society charitable activities in India and for broadcast of lectures on TV within UK, USA and Canada. The ad hoc donations for this year reached was just over £404,000.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF RADHA MADHAV SOCIETY (UK)

I report on the accounts for the year ended 5 April 2017 set out on pages four to seven.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.
