CACFO UK has pleasure in presenting our report and the examined financial statement for the year ended 31 March 2017.

Status

CACFO UK was established as a charitable incorporated organisation on 4th September 2013 and is governed by a constitution with voting members other than its charity trustees. Its predecessor, Croydon African Caribbean Family Organisation (CACFO) was established in October 1994.

Objective and principal activities of the charity

The objective of CACFO UK is to promote for the benefit of, but not exclusively, African and African Caribbean descendants in the Borough of Croydon without distinction of age, race, political or religious or other opinions, by associating the local authorities, voluntary organisations and inhabitants in common effort to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare, education or recreation and leisure time occupation for the benefits of the residents of Croydon. To manage, develop and secure CACFO UK (whether alone or in cooperation with any statutory authority or other persons or body) to further our objective.

Development, activities and achievements for the year

Delivery of a five-fold programme designed to help the physical and mental wellbeing of members remained at the heart of CACFO UK's work with elders in the community. Over the year gone by we continued with our effective delivery of:

- (i) Twice weekly group exercises to stimulate the mind, e.g. arts and crafts classes, regular quiz and reminiscing sessions and memory games;
- (ii) Twice weekly group exercises to help physical fitness and promote healthy lifestyles, e.g. seated exercise classes, yoga, plus talks from medical foundations responsible for Alzheimer's disease, diabetes, etc.
- (iii) Daily group recreational activities (e.g. board games) and regular day trips out (e.g. to seaside, local parks, etc.)
- (iv) Nutritious meals freshly cooked from scratch on our premises each day. For many elders this is their only hot meal of the day and therefore vital for their wellbeing!
- (v) Advice and signposting to services as demanded, e.g. pointing members to Advisory Services Croydon, etc.

Our tried and tested approach continues to help reduce the feeling of isolation and loneliness among the growing number of elders in the community.

Development, activities and achievements for the year (Continued)

Our daily minibus service continues to be an essential part of the delivery of CACFO UK's programme. Our new bus, secured through a bid to the Department for Transport, has greatly improved our efficiency, confidence and ability to make journeys to the benefit of our elders. We now do two client collection trips most days of the week and are able to undertake longer journeys without fear of break downs.

We have continued to work to improve our operational efficiency. Banking and invoicing has been moved online and our administrative processes streamlined. A new website has been built which coupled with targeted marketing has led to growth in the number of elders attending the day centre. Their average age is 85 and our oldest is 96 years old.

CACFO UK as a community-based asset is well placed to help meet increasingly demand for adult day services. Indeed expansion is essential if we are to help stem the tide of elders who find themselves in social isolation. We help our clients to have a 'life' not a care plan.

CACFO UK's Education Centre continued to provide an inclusive environment that allows children to overcome their fears, lack of confidence and behavioural issues in order to make strong progress in their academic learning and personal development. Our pupil numbers have grown due to greater provision or respite service. A balanced budget was achieved after successive years of overspending compared to Local Authority income.

The Management Committee remains grateful to London Borough of Croydon for its support as CACFO UK's sponsor for 10% of our income for the adult day centre and 80% of funding for the Education Centre.

We thank our loyal and longstanding body of volunteers and, not least, our small team of staff who help us on a daily basis to deliver so much for the community with so little. As ever, we salute our clients, whom we strive to help and who justify our ongoing efforts.

Financial Position

Details of the charity's financial affairs for the year under review are shown on pages 6-13 of the financial statement.

Reserves

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds at a level which equate to 12 months unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support cost. Currently most reserves have been earmarked for specific projects.

Risk Management

The trustees actively review the major risk which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining reserves at current levels, combined with an annual review of the controls over key financial systems, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks faced by the charity and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

Recruitment and appointment of Management Committee

- (d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the organisation will continue in business.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities should they exist.

REPORT OF THE EXAMINERS TO THE MEMBERS OF CROYDON AFRICAN CARIBBEAN FAMILY ORGANISATION UK

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Accounting Convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (Charities SORP FRS 102 and the Charities Act 2011).

CACFO UK constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102

(b) Income

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gift and is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the company, and is recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Investment income is included when receivable.

Incoming resources from charitable trading activity are accounted for when earned. Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to the consideration by its performance.

(c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates which are intended to write off the cost of the assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Motor Vehicles 10% Equipment and Furniture 25%

(d) Fund Accounting

Grants and similar income which are subjected to restrictions by the donors are shown as restricted funds and any expenditure incurred will be set off against the fund. All other income and expenditure are shown as unrestricted.

(e) Resources Expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accrual basis, inclusive of any VAT, which cannot be recovered. Expenditure which is directly attributable to specific activates has been included in these cost categories. Where costs are attributable to more than one activity, they have been apportioned across the cost categories on a consistent basis with the use of these resources.

(f) Value added tax

Value added tax is not recoverable by the charity and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

(g) Charitable activities

Cost of activities represents those cost incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for the beneficiaries. It includes both cost that can be allocated directly to such activities and those cost of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
