ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees present their report for the year ended 31 August 2017

Structure, Governance and Management

The Society is governed by its constitution, which was adopted on 24 October 2001.

The Society is a registered charity number 1089254. The charitable status of the Society was established on 7 November 2001.

The Society is run by the committee of management. All persons elected to the Committee at the AGM become trustees of The Society. Further members may be co-opted but would not become trustees.

Objectives and Activities

The Society's objects are to advance the education of the public in the dramatic and operatic arts and to further the development of public appreciation and taste in the said arts.

Public Benefit

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The Society provides opportunities for members to experience training and also performance opportunities in the theatrical arts. The public benefit from having the opportunity to experience live theatrical art performances in the local area.

Achievements and Review of the Year 2016/17

The Society has once again had a very good year in terms of cultural provision as well as cementing the Society's financial security. During the year the Society presented one full scale musical production which was 42nd Street at The McMillan Theatre at the beginning of May 2017 together with a Musical Review performed at the Bridgwater Arts Centre during the first week of December 2016. The Society also promoted a wonderful fundraising Concert - An Audience with Lesley Garrett - which was a huge coup for the Society. Securing such a talent and legend in musical theatre circles (as well as outside of them) and bringing her witty and highly entertaining evening to our Society's audiences really was a milestone event in the history of the Society. Both productions resulted in a financial excess' for the Society, in terms of around the world in song then this was a very small excess but given the niche audience a review show now appeals to, this was an exceptional result and a testament to the work the Pomeroys put in to achieve excellent management of the budget during this particular production. 42nd Street made a large excess around £3,000 - which can be seen in the notes to the Financial Statements. This excess was achieved primarily due to excellent budgetary control together with yet another sell out audience. The Lesley Garrett Concert, as you can see from the Financial Statements, has assisted with ensuring that the Society can continue to cover its liabilities in respect of the Clubroom and its general running costs as well as assisting with securing the Society's financial wellbeing going forward. We are very grateful to our Trustee, Paul Billing, and his small team for the tireless efforts in bringing these fundraising Concerts to us and continually achieving such excellent results. The Society also conducted some sundry other fundraising activities including the Carnival Park & Ride and Christmas Collections which again assists in ensuring that we can continue to invest in large budget productions as well as maintain our Clubroom premises.

We have, during the year, made some upgrades to the Clubroom, most notably being the central heating and LED lighting. It is important that we continue to invest in the Clubroom as the fabric of the building must be maintained and upgraded for the future use of Society Members. There are some quite exciting plans being formulated currently in relation to the Clubroom and I look forward to sharing some of these developments with you as we move forward.

42nd Street was presented with a Production Team of Brian Epps as Director, Shelly Smith as Choreographer and was Musically Directed by Tony Pomeroy. The production has achieved, not only sell out audiences, but also critical acclaim. The full nominations and awards from the various competitions have not been fully compiled at this stage. However, audiences and critics alike have raved at the quality of the performance. Tony Pomeroy conducted his very final performance as Musical Director for the Society on the closing performance of 42nd Street and was presented by the Society with a memento of his many years of service to the Society. Tony is to be congratulated and thanked for his tireless commitment to the Society and to every single production he has thrown his heart and soul into since he was first involved with the Society. We also thanked Tony for continuing with the governance of the Society on an ongoing basis now that he has retired from a Production Team role.

We now look forward to White Christmas being performed in November 2017 and The McMillan Theatre and are delighted to be able to announce that My Fair Lady will be being performed at The McMillan Theatre in spring 2018.

Financial Review

All monies received by the treasurer shall be paid into the Society accounts as directed by the committee. All funds which in the opinion of the committee are available for investment shall be transferred or paid into the account of the Society at such bank or building society as the committee direct. The account shall hold a sufficient reserve so that any possible loss on future productions can be fully funded and that, in addition, the Society is able to meet its financial commitments for the following twelve months.

The management committee consider that the year has been a fantastic success in terms of financial excesses, the Spring show was a large excess primarily due to the overwhelming success at the box office. Both fundraising concerts yielded significant gains, coupled with a fairly buoyant year of letting income covering the modest cost of maintaining the clubroom means that we enter 2017/2018 in one of the best financial positions ever known to the Society.

STATMEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

The trustees are required to prepare financial statements for each financial year in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. - c) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the charity, and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with applicable law, regulations and the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees have complied with a duty in section 4 of the 2011 Charities Act to have regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission.

1. Accounting policies

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Turnover

Turnover represents the total amount receivable in the ordinary course of the society's activities.
