#### TRUSTEES REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with current statutory requirements and the Statement of Recommended Practice – "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" effective January 2015.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The principal objects and activities of the charity are:

- 1. To work towards the elimination of racial discrimination.
- 2. To promote equality of opportunity and good relations between persons of different racial groups without distinction of sex, race or political, religious or other opinions.
- 3. To promote and organise co-operation in the achievement of the aforesaid purposes in particular but not exclusively in the area of York.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives, and in planning future activities.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

York Racial Equality Network (YREN) has managed to achieve its core functions this year by providing independent, impartial information and support to individuals who are experiencing racial harassment, discrimination and/or isolation. The organisation has also fulfilled its project requirements. The financial climate remained challenging; and, although austerity measures remained, YREN was able to ensure that its vital work continued and the organisation remained financially viable.

New project work, such as the Big Lottery Friendship Project and Tang Hall Big Local Outreach Work, provided us with opportunities to embed ourselves within a deprived area of the City, working in close partnership with groups and organisations working in the Tang Hall area. The Friendship Project enabled York's new refugees to join in community activities within a few weeks of their arrival in York, helping to eliminate feelings of isolation and exclusion. Both projects exceeded expectations in terms of quality of service and the quantity of diverse people attending.

The Joseph Rowntree Fund Strategic Grant, which came to an end in March 2017, left YREN with new aims and objectives. A new overall aim was to reduce racial inequality in York. This is to be achieved by: enabling BME voices to be better heard in York; increasing the confidence of BME people to express themselves and be mutually supportive; improving access to appropriate services and support for BME people; improving the knowledge and understanding of the wider community, agencies, businesses and public services of the needs of the BME population and the importance of combatting racial hatred, discrimination and harassment; and improving the level of Hate Crime reporting and the experience of BME people reporting Hate Crime.

The Charlie and Elsie Sykes Trust outreach work came to an end this year. It has enabled YREN to be flexible in its outreach work; in particular, identifying the need to be able to respond to outreach opportunities in all areas of the City. We hope to work the Trust again in future.

The Brelms Trust outreach work continues to exceed its targets. It enables YREN to continue to respond to outreach opportunities in areas of need.

The monitoring and outcome of the Comic Relief Empowered Voice Project enabled YREN to identify the need for this project to be extended until July 2018. We were delighted that Comic Relief supported us in this, and, having achieved our targets in the provision of equalities training, YREN will be concentrating on our BME Residents' Open Forums and volunteer recruitment.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE - Continued**

YREN is mindful of the Equality Act 2010 which states that those subject to the equality duty must, in the exercise of their functions, have due regard to the need to eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation, advance equality of opportunity between different groups and foster good relations between different groups. For this reason, we continue to encourage and support a number of multi-agency, multicultural approaches to race issues. This has been achieved through membership and participation in Without Wall One Planet York Partnership, the Fairness and Equality Board, The City of York Equality Advisory Group, the North Yorkshire Police Central Area Independent Advisory Group, and participation in a number of local groups and forums. YREN has also provided information and resources for individuals, organisations and the general community on race equality issues. We continue to enhance our work by contributing to targeted research and consultation requests, along with providing our own research (for example: YREN's 25th anniversary research report).

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

Note 10 to the financial statements shows the assets and liabilities attributable to the various funds by type and notes 6 and 7 describe the various funds of the charity and summarises the year's movement on each fund.

Our reserves policy, in line with good financial practice, is to maintain a minimum reserve of six months running costs in case of sudden loss of income or planned, managed closure of the organisation.

#### STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

York Racial Equality Network is a registered charity governed by its constitution adopted on 15 December 2000.

The trustees who hold regular meetings administer the charity. Day to day operations are dealt with by the salaried director.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), issued on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011, and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a 'true and fair' view and have departed from the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a 'true and fair view'. This departure has involved following the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2015 which has since been withdrawn.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

#### **Fund accounting**

Restricted funds are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for a specific purpose.

Designated funds are monies set aside by the trustees for particular purposes.

Unrestricted funds are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

#### Income

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

#### **Expenditure**

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

## Fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

Computers and equipment - 4 years

## **Operating leases**

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a time basis over the lease term.

### **Comic Relief Fund**

This grant from Comic Relief is funding 'The Empowered Voice' project, which aims to train culturally diverse individuals to act as community representatives on local partnerships to improve strategic decision making; set up an Equalities Network for staff and volunteers in mainstream organisations, to improve knowledge and confidence in working with people from diverse groups; provide Open Forum meetings for BME residents and their families, providing a safe environment in which people can voice their views and needs; and also improve YREN's communications with diverse communities and organisations by developing YREN's website and producing a new community newsletter.

## Charlie and Elsie Sykes Fund

Funding from the Charles and Elsie Sykes Trust provided an essential addition to our outreach service to individuals who would normally be unable to access services through lack of knowledge, accessibility and cultural barriers. It provided professional community outreach sessions, aimed at improving disadvantaged peoples' access to and take up of housing, healthcare, social activities and community engagement opportunities.

#### NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

## Joseph Rowntree Foundation Fund

This is funded by the Joseph Rowntree Foundation York Committee Fund. It is a strategic fund, which will enable the organisation to develop its role within the City of York. It will enable BME individuals and communities to have increased influence in local decision making; increase the effectiveness of representation work; increase access to services and support for BME individuals, and will provide improved services for BME residents as a result of collaboration.

#### **Brelms Trust**

This grant is providing YREN with the ability to provide a much-needed, flexible, information, support and advocacy outreach service, in disadvantaged areas of the city.

#### **Fixed Asset Fund**

This fund represents the net book value of fixed assets purchased from restricted income.

## **Big Lottery Fund**

The Amity Project (Big Lottery Fund) helped isolated individuals of all ages and others to build strong, diverse friendships in a multicultural setting. They had the opportunity to become better connected with social networks and the wider life of the City and improve their understanding of the opportunities available to them. The Project provided a safe environment to reflect on past and current experiences, and enabled access to one-to-one support to work towards overcoming any difficulties and realise their aspirations. It contributed towards stronger local communities, bringing diverse people together, breaking down ethnic and cultural barriers and reducing feelings of isolation, fear and exclusion. Issues of health inequality, mental/emotional health and wellbeing were improved through social interaction, stronger local networks and the encouragement of input by health and social care partners.

#### Tang Hall Big Local Fund

The Tang Hall Big Local Fund Outreach Project provided regular outreach sessions based at Tang Hall Community Centre, including work out in the local area. It primarily targeted local Black and Minority Ethnic residents, but was open to all, who were able to access information and support to address challenges in their lives through face-to-face contact with YREN staff, volunteers and partnership with other organisations such as Your Café and the Tang Hall Advice Hub. These partnerships helped to ensure that the Centre is accessible to, and being used by, all those that wish to do so. The project tackled issues of language, culture and confidence in accessing services, and the reduction of social isolation; furthermore, it improved the wider population's understanding of diverse cultures and provided opportunities for local people to act as volunteers, develop new skills and continue the work of the project beyond its period of funding.
