CONSTITUTION:

Eternal Light Ministries International started to meet informally during 2007 and the trustees signed a Declaration of Trust dated 25 October 2007 which is now considered the Trust Deed. It was formally registered as a charity on 14 November 2008 under charity number 1126715.

THE OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY ARE:

- I. The advancement of the Christian faith in the United Kingdom or overseas
- II. The advancement of both religious and secular education.
- III. The relief of sickness and poverty. **ORGANISATION**

The Trustees are joined by the Pastor to deal with the day to day management of the charity in accordance with the objectives.

ACTIVITIES:

The Youth Group

The Ministry is helping the Youth Group in the Ministry with Church activities. The Ministry is doing everything possible to encourage more youth to join the Ministry. In order to keep them away from the streets and from indulging themselves in unnecessary activities especially during the holidays, the Ministry kept them busy with church activities, teaching some of them how to play the musical instruments, held youth meetings etc. Parents are always present to support their children.

The Ministry had been able to advise and support two children whose parents are no longer members. The children have completed University both with First Class degrees and are now gainfully employed. Had it not been for the Ministry these children could have gone wayward.

Women Group

The women's fellowship paid visits to hospitals and also to other members who failed to attend church Services. They help each other to organise birthday parties. They help to support single parents. In their own leisure time some of them evangelise to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. Others have volunteered to help an elderly member of the Ministry to do her shopping and to collect her medications from the Pharmacy.

Visitations

The Ministry makes sure it pays a regular visit to members, especially those who are not regular to Church Services, also those who are sick. The pastor of the Ministry Rev.Emmanuel Nortey has being going to the hospital to visit the sick. Non members always come for prayer support from him and usually accompany them to the hospital to pray with their loved ones. On every first Sunday of the month Rev. Emmanuel Nortey (Head Pastor) organizes a free consultation session to listen and pray with both members and non-members of the Ministry. Rev. E. Nortey also advises children of single parents. The youth feel free to discuss issues with him which is a great help to them.

Annual Thanksgiving Service

The Ministry was able to organise the Annual Thanksgiving Service which was very successful. The Ministry inter acted with members from different Churches and was able to raise some funds to support the Ministry. There were visitors from the community.

Annual trip to Southend-On-Sea Beach

The Ministry was successful in organising a trip to Southend-On-Sea Beach during 2016 Summer School Holidays.

The Ministry invited people in the community and also people from other churches. The yearly summer trip to the beach allows the members of the Ministry to inter act with people from the community and other churches.

RISK ASSESSMENT:

We have reviewed our current provision and the strengths and weaknesses of our organization and identified opportunities

PUBLIC BENEFIT:

In all our activities we are mindful of the legal requirement for charities to provide public benefit, and have had regard to the guidance published in this connection by the Charity Commission.

ACCOUNTS:

These are set out on pages 3 and 4 which follow. Tithes and Offerings show a small increase during the year and we are grateful to God for His generosity. No Gift Aid has been received during the year as the claim was submitted later than usual but the amount will come in the following year. The giving at the annual thanksgiving service was well up on the previous year.

Due to an increase in rent and utilities the expenses were up but savings were made in other areas so that the total was only £300 more than the previous year and there was a surplus of £8,513 even before the Gift Aid so the year ended with a surplus on the Unrestricted Fund of £6,163. This has been added to the surplus brought forward to leave £29,681 to carry forward.

The Restricted Fund is for monies set aside for welfare purposes and £2,350 was raised during the year but there were no pressing needs so total funds to carry forward are now £8,355.

Total funds are now £38,036 and are considered satisfactory at this stage of the Ministry.

RESERVES

The trustees would like to acquire a permanent meeting place of their own and will need to build reserves for this purpose. In addition reserves to cover 6 months of expenses are desirable.
