St Christopher's Pre-School

Trustees Report

2016/2017

St Chrisopher's Pre-School is managed by a management Committee constisting of a Chair person - Leann Connery, Secretary - Shiela Bugden and Treasurer - Lesley Connery, together with a general committee made up of parents and carers of the children attending at any given time.

The Pre-school offers up to 30 hours per week of funded care including a lunch club for children 2-4 years. The main source of income is from local government funding with the committee undertaking fundraising to purchase items to enhance their childrens learning.

The Pre-school has spaces for up to 48 children with upto 24 attending per session. The Pre-school is open Monday - Thursday 9am-3.30pm and Friday 9am-12pm term time only.

The Pre-school has a manager and 4 fully qualified staff on site for each session.
