Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. Basis of independent examiner's statement My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

The above objectives were achieved due to a dedicated team of volunteers investing their time in Charls Tiwala and three part-time staff; working on the frontline with vulnerable women, and doing administrative tasks.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Between April 2016 and March 31st 2017 Charis Tiwala has supported people who have been affected by human trafficking or sexual exploitation within the sex industry. This is primarily through outreach to sex establishments and women who are working on the

Charis Tiwala has continued to build links/partnerships with other agencies, charitable bodies and institutions to help provide the best holistic care for the people that they support. In particular, Charis Tiwala worked closely with Hertfordshire Police in an advisory capacity as they set up the anti-trafficking unit (Tropic) for Herts.

Outputs achieved by Charls Tiwala:

- · 1496 hours of volunteering. 695 hours of which were outreach to sex establishments and women working on the streets, reaching 27 women and 1 transgender person; 67% UK
- born, 10% Eastern European and 23% Asian.

 Charis Tiwala continued to run Forte Bakery (teaching women in the sex industry basic baking skills and life skills). Three six week courses were run during April 2016 - March 31st 2017 and 9 women completed the courses.
- In May 2016 Charis Tiwala began running a weekly Bible Study group for any woman who they supported to attend if they were interested in exploring the Christian faith; 3 women regularly attend this group.

 - In July 2016 Charis Tiwala had a stand at a conference to raise awareness about human
- trafficking and sexual exploitation within the sex industry, the charity and to generate
- In October 2016 Charls Tiwala ran their first retreat for women in the sex industry; 2 women attended and stayed overnight on the retreat.
- Charis Tiwala delivered 21 hours of training about human trafficking and sexual exploitation to other professionals and community groups.
