Structure, Governance and Management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All church attendees who consider themselves as belonging to the worshipping community of St. Mark's are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll. All those on the Electoral Roll may stand for election to the PCC. The council should reflect the diversity of the church community. The PCC has been re-elected annually, however this year the PCC have agreed in principle to move to a more conventional 3-year rotating pattern – to be approved by the new PCC.

The PCC met for six business meetings during the year as well as the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

Objectives and Activities

St Mark's Kensal Rise is a local church family, seeking to live and share the love of Jesus by:

Bringing our Best in worship,

Nurturing Each other as disciples, and

Being the good news for Kensal Rise and beyond

The Church Council has the responsibility of working with the incumbent, Revd Will Leaf, and the staff team in promoting in the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. The PCC, through prayer and discussion, seeks to discover how best to encourage the church to fulfil its mission of 'Living and Sharing the Love of Jesus'.

Annual Review

Services:

The **electoral roll** now stands at 291, with 27 people having come off the roll and 10 people joining . Sunday morning services have an average attendance of 138 (over 16), and 63 (under 16). Our monthly Sunday evening services have an average attendance of 30.

There were a number of other special services during the year including the main Christian festivals, Harvest Sunday, Remembrance Sunday, a carol service (with choir), Christingle, Mothering Sunday, Father's Day.

Special Events:

In December 2017 more than 300 people attended the annual **Christmas Fair** raising more than £2,000. In March 2017 more than 90 people attended the church's **Weekend Away** at Kings Park Northampton.

Staff/Leadership:

There have been a number of changes in the church's staff and leadership during the year with some people moving on and others arriving.

Notably, our vicar, **Olly Ryder** moved down to Plymouth in May to serve as vicar of St Matthias Plymouth. A good number from St Mark's making the long trip down to see him licensed there.

With much support from the Bishop of Willesden and Archdeacon of Northolt, **Will Leaf** was licensed as vicar of St Mark's just four months later in September.

Rachel Bedford was ordained as deacon in July and joined us as curate from then – Rachel had already been placed at St Mark's while studying at St Melitus.

Chris Painter, our Children and Youth Worker moved on from St Mark's at the end of March. We are currently recruiting for two part time pastor roles for Children and Youth.

Ben Shave has continued to serve as Worship Director, with a particular emphasis on growing the team and infrastructure this year. Our thanks go to him and his team for all the hard work they put in as we seek to bring our best in worship.

Kellie Jarrett continues to be a constant presence in the vestry, skilfully booking out the church hall and taking care of the church's administration. As well as focusing on the plethora of tasks each day, fielding phone calls and other queries, Kellie can be found praying with many that come through the door and offering a listening ear and ready hug.

Alpha Courses:

We ran Alpha using the new film series in the Autumn and Spring terms and these were faithfully attended.

Small Groups:

There have been seven midweek small groups meeting in people's homes for food, friendship, worship, prayer, teaching and fun. Small Groups continue to be key to our vision of a church which nurtures each other in discipleship.

Children:

There are regularly between 50-100 **children** in **Kids' Church** and **Crèche** and three well attended midweek **Parent & Toddler Groups**.

Youth:

There have around 15 young people involved in the **Younger Youth Group** – Xcelerate (11-15) meeting on Friday evenings during term time for games, friendship, 'God slots' and social outings. Although this has been paused while we re-group the team, we are keen to maintain momentum in this area. There are also hopes to start up an older youth group once again re-connecting with some of the teenagers that we know

St. Mark's has a **Child Protection Policy** and an **Equal Opportunities Policy**. Any concerns regarding children's safety should be referred to the **Children's Safeguarding Officer**, Will Leaf. In accordance with Diocesan guidelines St Mark's also has a **Children's Champion**, Sue Bush, whose responsibility is to make sure children are nurtured within the worshipping life of the church.

Men's Ministry:

Between 6-12 mem regularly attend the monthly **Pints of View** group at the Island pub for beer, banter and theological discussion. A number of St Mark's members and others in the community are regularly involved in the St Mark's **Men's Football Team** run by Glenn Ford and Chris Ampofo at Capital City Academy.

Women's Ministry:

A breakfast was organised for over 50 women with a talk given by Sarah Boyle. Plans are in place for the next women's breakfast on June 10th.

Prayer

A week of prayer was held in September with a prayer room being available as a creative space to meet with God in the Upper Room.

Over 50s:

Around 15 people are involved in with **Wednesday Fellowship Over 50s Group** that meets weekly during term time for refreshments, games, talks, craft activities and social outings. Around 10 people are involved in the weekly **WISCO** (West Indian Senior Citizen's Organisation) group led by Norman Mitchell MBE that meets in the Church Hall for food, friendship, prayer and special events.

Community:

St Mark's continues to work with the parish **primary schools** (Princess Frederica, Kenmont, Furness Road) and **nurseries** hosting services, assemblies and some RE lessons. Revd Will Leaf takes weekly assemblies at the Church Primary School, Princess Frederica and is on the board of governors.

'Project Stork' initiatives have continued to be well supported this year, collecting clothes and gifts for women and children escaping domestic violence.

Mission Partners:

The PCC held a review of our Mission partnerships this year in an attempt to refine and strengthen our partner relationships.

Our aim is to grow our external giving so that we reach a figure of at least 10%, to that end we will be supporting the following partners financially:

There is Hope Malawi

A **Refugee Focus Evening** was held on 21st Nov with speakers from Refugee Support Network, Home for Good and keynote address from Innocent Magambi of There is Hope Malawi.

IntoUniversity Brent (IU) based at St Mark's continues to provide educational and mentoring support for local primary and secondary school children through Focus Weeks held in the Church and Classroom, school visits, homework clubs, and university and cultural trips. Sydney Wesley-Weeks has recently been appointed the team leader of five staff who are regularly joined by interns and students on work experience. We will be looking to agree a new lease agreement taking them up to 2020 and also encourage members of St Mark's to support by mentoring and offering work placements.

Hall Bookings:

The Church Hall and Upper Room are available for booking and are in constant use throughout the year for regular and one off events including children's parties, resident association meetings, Councillor's Surgeries, Pilates, La Jolie Ronde (French classes), funeral receptions and other events and activities.

Buildings and Maintenance:

This has been another busy year for those involved in the upkeep of the church and hall. For details of the work done to replace the hall floor, work on roofing, boilers and electrics, to name a few, please see the Fabric and Ornaments report. Particular recognition and thanks are given to **Andrew Sturge** and **Glenn Ford** for many hours of work invested on our behalf.

Financial Review

There has been another busy year in the treasury which saw **Katie Allam** our co-treasurer depart for New York City and **Paul Kidner** being co-opted as co-treasurer alongside the long-serving **Angie Hansel**. They have been ably assisted by **Sinitta Falconer** in a book-keeping capacity. There has been much work to do in improving our processes, bringing in a new budgetary structure, submitting Charity Commission reports and making Gift Aid applications. INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE PCC OF ST MARK'S CHURCH KENSAL RISE

I report on the accounts of the PCC for the year ended 31 December 2016.
