Independent Examiner's Report to the PCC of St. Saviour's Great Moor, Stockport

This report on the accounts of the PCC for the year ended 31st December 2017, which are set out on pages 1 to 5, is in respect of an examination carried out under Regulation 3(3) of the Church Accounting Regulations 1997 and the s.43 of the Charities Act 1993.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

As the members of the PCC you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, you consider that the audit requirements of Regulation 3(3) of the Church Accounting Regulations 1997 and section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to issue this report on those accounts in accordance with the terms of Regulation 25 of the Church Accounting Regulations 1997 and Regulation 7 of the Charities (Accounting and Reporting) Regulations 1995.

Basis of Independent Examiner's report

My Examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 43(7)(b) of the Act and to be found in the guidance from the CBF. That examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the PCC and a comparison of the accounts presented with these records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent Examiner's statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:-

Report of Accounts 2017

Good morning. Firstly I'd like to thank Peter Lainton for the help he gives me in collating monies and banking them. He is very meticulous and that obviously helps me enormously. Can I also thank those who so carefully count the collections for us every Sunday, particularly Ashley and Brian. And not forgetting Stuart Jones who inspects our accounts so diligently.

Having given you a week to look through the accounts I propose to highlight a few matters and leave you to raise questions over matters that interest you.

In 2017 we had £2,267 more money 'in' than money 'out' which meant we recovered some of our reserves lost in 2016. We started the year with £29,022 in the bank and finished with £31,289.

Total **income** in 2017 was up by £4134. The biggest contributor to this was our 'Talent' fund-raising initiative which raised £4828 (net of the £1600 initial outlay). Other contributing factors were a sponsored walk raising £300 and Planned Giving and collections being up by £1213.

Our two Fairs raised £1974 more than in 2016 when we did not hold the Summer Fair and the Community Café surplus was up by £50 (£3750).

Against this the PCC fees were down £1004 and there were no legacies (£2020 in 2016)

Total **payments** this year were down by £7032 which is due to reductions:

- Charitable giving £3502
- Upkeep of the Church £436
- Vicarage maintenance £2742
- Church Hall surplus £5199

Against these savings we had the

Parish Share up by £1532

In conclusion - on the plus side we have:

- A very compassionate congregation who continue to respond generously to appeals and who give freely of their talents and time to do the many jobs around the Church.
- We have a well administered Church. I think we should be very proud of our Vicar who is able to run our very active Church so professionally with Admin costs contained at £6092

On the flip side

- We need to continue to address and increase our income through our planned giving and social fund raising.
- We need to continue to be prudent in managing our expenditure
- We need to continue to maximise our rental opportunities with the Church Hall
- The PCC is already addressing these on your behalf but I am taking this opportunity to increase your awareness and thereby gain your support for our endeavours.
