REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

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To provide support for those in need in the community for those who are in need and experiencing poverty, unemployment, hardship and domestic abuse.

We collect donated furniture, household items, and clothes that we sell or give to the community, people referred to us from social care, multi-agency teams, health care teams, other voluntary organisations, charities and refuges.

We provide drop in for welfare benefits advice and domestic abuse, a community kitchen and laundry service.

We support people to volunteer with us and arrange for them to access training and development, we have placements for the University of Derby law school.

Due regard has been given by the Trustees in respect of guidance given by the Charities Commission on public benefit in deciding the above objects and activities the charity undertakes.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Salcare has enjoyed good support from both Fareshare and 3663, and we have seen an increase in donation from our local supermarkets and the community.

Harvest festival sees a wealth of fresh fruit and vegetables, which we use in our community kitchen and give away to our service users.

We have seen an increase in the need for a foodbank as the universal credit has rolled out, and although we have been able to meet the need, donations of basics are still needed.

Escape specialist domestic abuse support project has continued to support all victims and works with any gender from any community. Despite losing lottery funding, this service has been sustained by volunteers and student placements from the University of Derby.

The community kitchen continues to flourish, and is a meeting place for the community. We have managed to maintain our low prices and use food from donations for the meals.

Staff and board members

David Howe resigned as chair in June 2016, with Shelly Scott taking up the chairship as acting chair.

There have been new board members, who met with staff in July to introduce themselves and have an opportunity to meet with them.

We have remained quorate throughout the year.

One of our longest serving staff members retired in December 2016, Trevor Carlile. Trevor has been a member of the Salcare team for over 12 years and he will be missed by the team and customers.

Two members of staff left, Wendy O'Toole and Kevin Ward in November 2016. Dena Trossell took over as single head of services in December 2016.

Collections and deliveries

The warehouse and charity shop have both seen a downturn with the growth of selling pages and facebook, we have now got a Salcare facebook page and have had some success selling items. Our social media presence is an area we need to develop and grow.

Community development

Salcare has developed a strong partnership with the University of Derby School of Law, Criminology and social science, we have had placements from the Law school and taken part in student research and lectures.

Our partnership with the university school of therapeutic services has also grown and we have students on placement who deliver art therapy to our service users.

- Volunteer opportunities for those with additional needs

Funding promotion and service development

This year saw and end to the Big lottery funding, and a loss of funding from NHS England. However we have continued to move forward and been able to achieve and sustain the organisation by efficiency savings and securing other funding from local authority, community foundation, paid training sessions and donations.

The board of trustees is mindful of the challenges ahead, and a key piece of work will be a new business plan and a fundraising strategy.

We have developed a facebook page for Salcare and Escape, and continued to look for funding to both sustain Salcare core and also to develop new services to add to the Salcare 'family'

FINANCIAL REVIEW

A deficit of £52,834 was recorded in the year ended 31st March 2017. This was due to the reduction in grant income generally; the major difference in that area was the National Lottery funding.

The Board undertakes to hold at least two months' running costs in reserve, to be held in a separate account from the main current account.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The organisation is a company limited by guarantee incorporated on 4th August 1997 and registered as a charity on that date. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New Trustees are actively sought and encouraged to join the Board and the organisation is eager to recruit new trustees with relevant skills.

The Board will be undertaking a skills audit as part of the business planning for the future of Salcare.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property	- 2% on cost
Plant and machinery	- 25% on reducing balance
Motor vehicles	- 25% on reducing balance
Computer equipment	- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
