The trustees are pleased to present their annual report together with financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

Structure, governance and management

Northern Lights Metropolitan Community Church is a registered charity (no.1093009) and was registered on 17th July 2002.

The charity is governed by its constitution adopted on 7th October 2001 and amended on 21st April 2002, 10th July 2005 and 31st January 2016.

Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting of the charity and stand for a period of three years. Trustees can also be co-opted as required. In April 2016 Miss C L West had served two terms of 3 years on the Board and as per the constitution stood down at the Annual General Meeting. The Rev C Eggleston also stood down from her role as Pastor at Northern Lights MCC on the 21st May 2016. Miss K Murray-Borberg resigned from the Board on the 9th August 2016. Miss C West was co-opted on to the Board on the 4th January 2017.

Objectives and activities

The charitable objects of Northern Lights Metropolitan Community Church (NLMCC) are to advance the Christian religion by proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ in Newcastle and elsewhere by providing Christian fellowship, worship, witness, action and service.

The main activities undertaken for the public benefit during the year have been as follows:-

- Weekly Sunday worship services were held.
- Monthly Sunday Family Service.

- Offered different opportunities for worship during the week, those were open to all.
- We took part in Newcastle Pride 2016 and again led the Candle Lit Vigil for the event as well as contributing to the Family Zone through the Family Service.
- At Harvest time we collected food goods and shared these with The Peoples Kitchen.
- We continued to donate clothes and household goods to the West End Refugee Service.
- We continued to run Chill and Grace, a monthly lunch which continued to be popular. Due to volunteer demands this was paused later in the year but we will look to continue to support the informal gathering.
- "Feast on Friday" continued and this has been a great way for members, both old and new, to get to know each other. New volunteers have continued to host this.
- The social event, Tiffin & Tiara's which was started in 2015 has continues to meet monthly in a local coffee shop once a month.
- The monthly Family Service continued through the year. This is held on a Sunday morning and has been very well attended both by families already in the church and families who have had no involvement before.
- We continued to work with MESMAC running "Rainbow Home". This is a monthly opportunity for LGBT asylum seekers to meet in an informal gathering to receive support, both practical and emotional, as well as a general time of fellowship.

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission in determining the activities undertaken by the Charity.

Achievements and performance

Achievements during the year were as follows:-

Northern Lights MCC has continued to develop in our ministry to our community and attract new members and regular and less-regular attendees. For the majority of the year we have been without a formal, full-time pastor following the resignation of our previous pastor Rev. C Eggleston. This has ushered in a period of transition and reflection for the Church. Through this we have actively engaged the congregation, members and non-members to understand views on the next stage of development for the Church.

Working with our wider denomination we have put in place the blocks to take forward the search for a new pastor and brought together the Pastoral Search Committee including volunteers from the membership. This is an important activity and stage in preparing to formally launch the search. This has also provided an opportunity to reflect and prepare to move forward with the life of the Church.

The Church has been pleased to see a growth in the representation from the Trans community within our membership and congregation. This is a blessing and shows an important area for the Church to further develop and ensure that we are meeting the needs of all our members.

In accordance with our statutes, the Board completed a review of the membership. A number of non-active members resigned and some were removed following the process in the constitution. Although this reduced the total number of members those left are currently active.

The Rev K Harford has remained as Clergy on Staff. This is an unpaid position, attending one weekend each month to help with the Sunday Service, Rainbow Home and other events. Kate has again brought valuable perspective, support and capacity to the Church taking on a strong role in community engagement and pastoral care for which we are very greatful.

The Rainbow Home Steering Committee has continued to meet regularly. Their role is to support the running of the monthly meeting, offer advice and guidance to the two workers and

support applications for a grant towards an employed worker. Additional funding has been sought to extend this role which is positive.

The Church has benefitted from and helped develop leadership within the congregation as we seek to empower all members and friends of the Church to take a leading role which matches their gifts and interest.

Despite the transition following the resignation of the pastor, Northern Lights MCC has continued to be active across a range of spiritual and social activities within the Church and sought to engage with others within the area and the wider LGBT community maintaining a high-quality of worship and networks.

Financial review

The year has proved to be a somewhat irregular year financially with a significant reduction in costs and expenditure due to the vacant pastor post and a utilisation of existing materials to support worship and activities. This was partially offset by a significant reduction in regular giving as some members and attendees left the Church and a number of regular givers were required to reduce giving due to changing circumstances and the on-going financial constraints in the local area.

The charity has therefore ended the year in a positive position with increased cash balanced with an outstanding gift aid claim to be submitted in the 2017/8 financial year. The Church was therefore able to strengthen the reserves available through the deposit account with no outstanding loans or debts.

As the Rainbow Home activities became more established during the year the two accounts were separated, although these remained linked. This is part of Rainbow Home progress to become established as a stand-along charity.

Northern Lights MCC, including Rainbow Home therefore held funding in three accounts as of the 31st March 2017. Northern Lights MCC Cafbank account - £6,757.89 Rainbow Home Cafbank account - £7,365.61 Northern Lights MCC Deposit account (Epsworth) - £17,554.71

During the year Northern Lights MCC received a generous legacy from the estate Joseph Dowson of £7,668.24.This has been moved into the deposit account to provide for large future growth actions such as the purchase of our own premises or to support the transition to a new pastor.

Our principal source of funding remains from the members and friends of Northern Lights MCC. The largest areas of expenditure are for hire of an office and rooms at St James church and travel costs for staff. Staffing costs were considerable reduced in the year due to absence of a pastor.

We also set up a new pension scheme through the NEST scheme to ensure that adequate pension options are available to staff for the Church and to ensure that legal requirements are met. This replaced our previous approach to pension support.

This gives the charity a base and human resources aid the advancement of our purpose.

Trustees responsibilities in respect of the financial statements

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the year end and of its incoming resources and resources expended during the year. In preparing those financial statements the Trustees are required to

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently

- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed and

- Prepare financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose at any time with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the charity's assets and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES

For the year ended 31 March 2017

I report on the financial statements of Northern Lights Metropolitan Community Church for the year ended 31 March 2017, which are set out on pages 6 to 11.
