

Our AGM was held on 19th May 2017, and we managed to get 11 parents to the meeting. The Group has made a net loss of £924.27 for the year, however there is Gift Aid to be recouped. The parents voted unanimously to increase subscriptions to £10 per month from September 2017. The bank account stands at c£3.4K.

We still intend to sell the Scout Hut by auction, subject to approval by the District. It is a cost to the Group (c.£800 in the accounts), and has limited use as storage, even, as it is damp. We are preparing a sale pack, and will proceed with the sale by the end of the year. We are discussing with the local church ways in which we can collaborate, as the church is looking at making its space for the community as well as worship.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of 7HV, and as such both Cubs and Beavers are working on looking at Scouting through the years in the village. There are thoughts of publishing a book or creating some sort of merchandise to celebrate.

Stephen Molloy Group Scout Leader the Group catinp to Hesley Wood, Sheffield in December. This was the first time for many years and we had 7 scouts attended even meeting Father Christmas.

Trips to Green Withens Sailing, Rokt at Brighouse for climbing also to the Silver Blades at Bradford arranged as a leaving party for Holly & Ria. We did the Athletes badge and a first the Geocashing badge. The plan now is to concentrate on working for the challenge badges and let us hope the next Chief Scout Awards are soon to follow.
