Transported to storage location provided free of charge by Wilkinson Vintners (trustee Patrick Wilkinson is a director of Wilkinson Vintners)

Cortex Atletico in Paris held a show of Charles Mason early drawings in April 2016, and published a catalogue to accompany the exhibition. One drawing and a small sculpture was sold. The funds from the sale have been transferred to the bank account and will be used as a bursary for a student in the future.

Set up an initial meeting with Theatre Company 'Told By An Idiot' about offering a bursary to a theatre set designer. 'Told By An Idiot' are interested in setting up a Naomi Wilkinson Award for a unique female designer which the trust would support.
