## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Society has partnered with the Honourable Society of Gray's Inn to host a capital-wide moot competition called the London Mooting League whose aim was to provide a true-to-form legal advocacy experience for King's College London students as well as students from other participating universities.

The Society has entered into various sponsorship agreements with barristers' chambers, law firms, etc. in order to ensure that all our vocational training remains free.

The Society has organised a panel of international legal practitioners who shared their experience with students about the particularities of legal practice across multiple jurisdictions.

The Society has organised a moot competition in the Royal Courts of Justice before a High Court Judge, a seasoned Queen's Counsel, and a Circuit Judge in order to provide students with a realistic advocacy experience as well as tailored feedback.

The Society has sponsored students to attend the Inner Temple Inter-Varsity Mooting hosted by the Honourable Society of the Inner Temple.

The Society has partnered with a legal bookshop to organise a moot whose winners receive free book vouchers to assist with the financial hardship of studying without disposable income.

The Society organised an annual dinner to allow for students to network with barristers and judges in order to assist them in applying for mini-pupillages and other forms of work experience.

In accordance with the Society's governing documents, the trustees aim to hold the amount of 5,000 Pounds sterling in reserve in a savings account in the Society's name.

The Society was able to hold this amount in reserve at fiscal year's end. The total funds held in reserve totaled 5,749.57 Pounds sterling. The Trustees have assessed this level of reserves as adequate in order to ensure that the Society is solvent going into the next academic year in order to pay debts owed prior to the collection of new membership fees.
