## **Trustees' Annual Report for 2017**

**This year's team**: Trudi Massey, director of youth work, started studying for her degree in September. In August, SWYM (South West Youth Ministries) trainees Ed and Tim moved on to fulltime study courses and were replaced by Matt and Jack, first year SWYM trainees on the "Be Transformed" course. Laura stayed with the team as a second-year trainee and is now following the degree course. This is a strong, well-motivated team who work well together.

**Funding:** Full accounts for 2017 have been independently examined and uploaded to the Charity Commission website. Catalyst is funded entirely by local giving. In brief, the work in 2017 was sustained by gifts from TACT churches of £11400, regular supporter donations of £13700 and one-off special gifts of £10000 which generated a further sum of over £5000 in gift aided tax.

- Youth clubs at Tavistock College and Mount Kelly
- Christian Union lunch clubs at Tavistock College and Mount Kelly Seniors
- Saturday Night Out at TMC
- House groups for teens in two age groups
- Mentoring in Tavi College and at Horrabridge, Bere Alston primary schools
- Fun club at Horrabridge primary school
- Support groups in Years 7,8,9 at Tavi College
- Thirsty Thursday outreach at Mount Kelly seniors
- Donuts at Dusk outreach event in Bere Alston
- Special one-off events such as Soul Survivor

### School mentoring:

"Journeying with a young person as a consistent and reliable role model who is quick to listen, offer the young person a safe space to unpack life, and present a platform to empower the young person to bring about a positive change in their own life and build towards a bright future." Catalyst work with Tavistock College to provide mentors so the young people have someone who will spend time listening and supporting them throughout the year. Each mentor is matched with a young person referred by the Head of Year. They meet for one hour around once a fortnight in school for up to a year. We now have 14 trained mentors in addition to the Catalyst team. Several mentors have taken on a second mentee to meet demand. We will still be seeking mentors as the year goes on to support all the young people who would benefit and to provide mentors in local primary schools where there is an invitation.

The future:A decision is made each year in late Spring as to the size of the team for the followingSeptember, based on levels of giving, anticipated church funding and available grants.We seek tomaintain the current team size.Feb 2018
