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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the Charity as set out in the Trust Deed are:

- (1) To restore, preserve, repair, maintain, improve, beautify and reconstruct the churches of St Peter's and St Andrew's, Thanet, and the monuments, ornaments, fixtures and fittings therein.
- (2) To advance the education of the public in the history, architecture and work of the churches of St. Peter's and St. Andrew's, Thanet.

Significant activities

Financial assistance to both churches enabling continued repair and renovation programmes through membership subscription and fund raising activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Once again the Charity has had another successful year in the provision of funds for St. Peter's and St. Andrew's Churches.

In total grants of £8,949 (2015: £28,621) have been made to the Churches.

In addition, the church received a legacy of £138,028 from the late James Gillespie.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The Trustees aim is to maintain a reasonable reserve to be able to respond to emergencies, should they arise and also give ongoing revenue. The surplus reserves are placed on deposit with the CBF Church of England Deposit Fund.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Charity is governed by its Trust Deed adopted on 17 May 2000 and registered as a charity with the Charity Commission on 15 September 2000 (amended 17 May 2006).

Membership of the Charity shall be open to any person over the age of 18 years interested in furthering the objects and who has paid the annual subscription. The Executive Committee is to propose an alteration to the 'Constitution', by resolution at a general meeting, to increase the number of Ex-Officio members.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisational structure

The Charity and its property is administered and managed by the members of the Executive Committee which is organised as follows:-

Honorary officers: at the annual general meeting of the charity the members shall elect from among themselves a chairman, a secretary and a treasurer, who shall hold office from the conclusion of that meeting.

Other honorary officers as specified below: not less than 3 and not more than 4 members elected at the annual general meeting who shall hold office from the conclusion of that meeting.

Ex-Officio members: 4 - the Vicar, the Priest at St. Andrew's Church, and the two Churchwardens.

3 nominated members: appointed by the Parochial Church Council of St. Peter's and St. Andrew's Churches.

The Executive Committee may in addition appoint not more than 3 co-opted members but so that no-one may be appointed as a co-opted member if, as a result, more than one third of the members of the Executive Committee would be co-opted members.

All the member of the Executive Committee shall retire from office together at the end of the annual general meeting next after the date on which they came into office but they may be re-elected or re-appointed.

Reverend Jan Durrans was invested as the vicar of St Peter's and Richard Collins and Graham Silsbury are joint church wardens for St. Andrews.

Induction and training of new trustees

The existing trustees are responsible for the initial induction, training and legal obligations under charity law, the contents of the trust deed, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
