Review of the Season 2016/17

This was the choir's 43rd season and concerts were performed in Ashbourne, Matlock and Derby.

The first concert of the season on November 26th 2016 was a performance of Handel's Messiah. A superb group of soloists helped to make the event truly memorable.

The annual Christmas Cracker took place on 10th December 2016. This proved once again to be an unqualified success and remained one of the choir's major fundraising events of the year.

The third concert of the year on March 25th 2017 was a Last Night of the Proms, complete with the traditional flag waving and audience participation.

The final concert of the year was a performance of Bach's B Minor Mass in Derby Cathedral on 20th May 2017.

As well as performing in its own right, the Society also organises training events in the shape of a Choral Day and a Choral Weekend. This year was no exception and the two events brought singers to Derbyshire from far and wide. The popularity of these educational events means that the choir is able to put on ambitious programmes and engage the highest quality of soloists and orchestras to the benefit of its Derbyshire audiences.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Derbyshire Singers

I report on the accounts of the Trust for the year ended 31^{st} August 2017. The accounts show that a net surplus of £893 (2015/16 £5,027) was recorded for the year. Balances stood at £66,858 (2015/16 £65,965) at that date.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under Section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the 1993 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.
