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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

for the Year Ended 31 December 2017

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

To advance the Christian faith, and to relieve sickness and financial hardship and to promote and preserve good health by the provision of funds, goods or services of any kind.

Significant activities

We have continued to pursue the objectives and aims with enthusiasm. Redeemer attracts new people and new members have been added to the church family. We do not yet have our own church building where the whole of the congregation can meet as a family on Sunday mornings. The church meets as a family, weekly on Sunday mornings at hired locations. This has been a significant step forward as we outgrew our homes and needed this extra space from May 2016.

The church continues to be involved in local and international humanitarian efforts through its affiliation to New Frontiers and Relational Mission family of churches and other countries have received physical and financial help through our link with New Frontiers. The church has begun to partner with other churches relationally with the aim of serving the community. A single member of our church is a trained counsellor for this vital service. The church encourages and supports our members in partnering with already existing projects in the town and we have members in services such as the Hospital, teaching, Police and more. Our current regular gatherings are;

- Sunday Meetings
- Prayer Gatherings
- Small Home Groups

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

2017 has been a year of rapid growth for Redeemer Church. Average Sunday attendance grew to a monthly average of 62. We baptised 6 people and are growing with in house financial giving. We have partnered with other local churches in serving the community, particularly through the large scale 'Colchester Family Fun Day.'

We hosted our network's Pioneer training weekend, attended and helped run our 'sphere' camping weekend festival with many members carrying out significant roles. Hugh Pearce and other members served at the Malaga Pioneer Church Planting conference and other members undertook a ministry trip to Frankfurt, Germany.

Support is regularly given to those who are struggling in terms of practical efforts such as personal financial support by members in the church, transport, advice and counsel and temporary accommodation. We have begun communication with a community project that supports those who have left hospital and are in need of ongoing support whilst they settle at home - and so taking pressure of local services.

We have begun to look for a new venue due to our growth, but also our desire to expand our activities to serve the community.

Our Small Groups multiplied into 2 groups and we desperately need to multiply further.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 December 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash, current bank accounts and deposit bank accounts with no withdrawal limitations.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised where then charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially settled at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.
