# Trustees' Annual Report and Accounts 2017

## **Objectives**

Our objective continues to be one of enabling all people to worship at our church and to live out their faith through worship and prayer, learning about the Gospel, and developing knowledge and trust in the Lord Jesus. We provide pastoral care for those in the local community of Markyate and take part in missionary and outreach work. We maintain high standards of maintenance of our Church building and facilities and share this with our village community.

#### **Achievements and Performance**

## Worship and Preaching

Church services are open to all: each Sunday morning public worship is at 10.30 am. Regular Services are provided for all ages from newborn babies through children and youth, to middle aged and older. We provide a creche room, and a Sunday class for children aged 4-11

In the absence of an appointed minister Sunday services have been organised by members of the Leadership Team and led by visiting preachers and by our own members. Preaching has been on different themes including New Beginnings, Being Wholehearted (using readings from Samuel), Easter Story from John's Gospel, The Apostles, Philippians and Evangelism.

Each month we have continued with our informal service on the second Sunday of each month called Messy Church, which attracts families from our village. On the same Sunday, as an alternative to Messy Church we hold a quieter and more reflective evening service called Nightlight led by one of our members.

#### Praver

A variety of prayer times have taken place throughout the year mainly asking for guidance for our future and for a new minister.

## Growth in Faith

An Alpha course took place in January and February with a follow up in November and December. In May the church took part in a national prayer initiative called Thy Kingdom Come. In November a new Bible Study group began.

#### Membership

There were 39 members on 31 December 2017. One member died this year and two new members have joined. Several friends are currently seeking membership.

#### **Pastoral Care**

Members are cared for through pastoral care groups with the help of a pastoral care volunteer who visits those in need in the community. Four of our members attended a day course at Waverley Abbey on Paraclesis.

# **Youth Work**

The Youth Work has been led by two of our members with assistance from a local Christian youth group called 267. Youth work in 2017 has been active in a variety of Saturday evening events such as Pizza Night, Film Nights, Ten Pin Bowling, British Bake off Competition. These Saturday events have been followed on Sunday evening by a youth worship service called Fuel. There is also a monthly event called Fiasco which includes Fun and Games and a time to learn about God and worship.

#### **Church Activities**

Regular church activities are Jack and Jill's toddler group, MBC cafe, Art Class, Keep Fit, Christian book reading group and Baptist Ladies Fellowship.

We held a successful two day 'Noise Project' in August which saw young and old working together to provide practical support and help in the community giving the opportunity to share the gospel in words and action.

At the beginning of September a Holiday at Home tea was held for mainly elderly folk from the community, and a film showing of 'Elf' hosted by one of our members in December attracted an all-age audience of 35.

# Mission and evangelism

We have continued to support financially a broad range of mission activities.

## **Ecumenical relationships**

The church is a member of Churches Together in Markyate. Joint services took place on Women's World Day of Prayer, a Good Friday Walk of Witness, and on Remembrance Day.

#### **Ministerial Search**

The trustees have continued to seek to appoint a new minister throughout the year using the Baptist Union settlement process, through an advertisement in the monthly magazine 'Premier Christianity' and explored possibilities of a trainee minister through Baptist Theological colleges. The trustees interviewed 1 applicant from the Christianity magazine advert and 4 applicants from the Baptist Union Settlement process. One of the latter, Phillip Coffin came to preach in October and for his first interview. He was invited for a second interview on 8th November. The Leadership Team voted unanimously to ask him to "Preach with a View" on 26th November and a subsequent special members' meeting overwhelmingly voted to invite him to be our next minister, which he accepted. He will start his ministry on Easter Sunday 2018.

#### **Volunteers**

The trustees want to thank all who work so hard and give so freely of their time to keep our church running and making it the lively and vibrant community that it is. Many also make valuable contributions by bringing their expertise to the benefit of the church by ensuring financial resources are used responsibly and that high standards of workmanship are achieved by those contracted to maintain or repair the fabric of the church or to supply goods or services.

#### Hopes and dreams for the future

Markyate Baptist Church continues to aspire to being a 'Church without walls' in our village community and we continue to work through what this means. We believe it does mean us to be inclusive, not exclusive in our church life offering Christian love, hospitality and acceptance to all, breaking down barriers between church and village in order to communicate the gospel of Jesus Christ. We believe we have found a new minister who also has a vision for a Church to be without Walls and who we hope can help us achieve this. We feel he has a great deal of experience in growing and equipping his flock. He is a gifted preacher and has a deep personal faith and heart for people. We are grateful to God for leading him to us and we are excited at the prospect of working alongside him.

# Structure, governance and management

The Church is governed and regulated by its own members where all aspects of the work of the church are subject to the approval of the members at meetings held approximately every three months. The Leadership Team is composed of all the trustees who meet monthly to deal with church administration and pastoral concerns and jointly are responsible for preparing the

agenda for members' meetings. The moderator, a Baptist minister appointed by the church – Revd. G. Clarke of St. Albans - chairs LT meetings and Members' meetings of the church.

The church's constitution takes the form of the model Baptist Union Approved Governing Document which describes, amongst other matters, the objectives and activities of the church and the appointment of trustees.

Alan Ruffhead gave notice that he would retire as treasurer on 31 December 2017 and Jim Salmon will succeed him as treasurer in 2018 assisted by Claire Adejumo together with the church's administrator appointed in June 2017.

#### Financial review

Total income in 2017 amounted to £92,213 compared with £93,688 in 2016 and total expenditure was £37,867 (£57,815).

Donations to a variety of missions totaled £9,566 (£8,828); these are detailed on page 6.

The Building Fund – a restricted fund – intended for improvements and extensions to the church building grew modestly during 2016 by £2,724 to £90,308 with expenditure of £1,385

The church has no external source of income, other than the occasional hiring out of the church premises. While the pastoral vacancy lasts, the manse is being let out at a commercial rate and these rentals together with voluntary donations are used to meet the running costs and maintenance of the church building, salaries and associated employment costs, and for other purposes in accordance with the church's constitution. The continuing pastoral vacancy has resulted in low ministerial costs and negligible manse expenses. The financial health of the church remains good and adequate controls are in place to give early warning of any changes for better or worse. The reserves policy of the church is to maintain the equivalent of approximately 3 months' general running costs – currently estimated at £5,000 per month but with these increasing substantially in 2018 as a result of appointing a new minister who will move into the manse, the rental income will cease causing a significant reduction in the church's receipts while expenses will increase with new employment costs. All surplus unrestricted funds, £83,005 at year end, are now regarded as reserves.

# **Accounting Policies**

The accounts are prepared in accordance with "Accounting and Reporting by Charities – Statement of Recommended Practice" (SORP 2005) issued by the Charity Commission.

**Donations and Grants** are accounted for when received.

**Unrestricted funds** represent income which has no specific instructions from the donor about how it can be used and is therefore used by the trustees for any of the church's ordinary purposes.

**Designated funds** represent sums set aside out of unrestricted funds for specific purposes but which can be transferred in whole or in part back into general funds at any time.

**Restricted funds** represent donations received or invited for a specific purpose. The funds may only be spent on the specific purpose for which they were given. A donation of £2,890 was received from the estate of a member who died in 2016. There were no directions as to how the money should be used and the trustees decided to restrict the donation to purposes connected with children's activities and audio-visual equipment improvements. The proceeds of an insurance claim against the theft of the church minibus in 2016 - £9570 - is also restricted for the future purchase of a replacement vehicle.

**Endowment funds** are funds whose capital must be maintained, only income from the investment being used as restricted or unrestricted depending on the purpose for which the endowment was established. The church has no such funds.

**Fixed assets** - the church premises and the manse 50 Buckwood Road, Markyate are included in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities at insurance value because reliable cost information is not available and in the opinion of the trustees a valuation would incur costs out of proportion to the benefit gained by a user of the accounts.

**Other assets** retained for the church's own use are shown at their latest insured value.

**Governance costs** – no legal fees incurred in 2017.

**Pensions.** The previous minister was a member of the Baptist Pension Scheme, a final salary defined benefit scheme which is not contracted out of the State second pension. The scheme is a multi-employer scheme and it is not possible to identify the assets and liabilities of the scheme which are attributable to the church. When the employment of the active member ceased in April 2015, a cessation event occurred and as a participating employer, the church became liable for an employer debt. The church took advantage of initiating a period of grace in order to be treated as if it still employed an active member, and continued through 2017 to make deficit contributions at a rate calculated by the Scheme's administrator. With the appointment of an accredited Baptist minister, an existing Scheme member, taking up his post in April 2018, the 3 year period of grace will end with 1 month to spare before a cessation event is due to be triggered. The employer debt – were a cessation event to occur – according to the Scheme's administrator's latest estimate is shown in the accounts as a contingent liability.

**Staff and Trustees**. The church employs an administrator and a cleaner, both part time who are not obliged, and have chosen not, to join a pension scheme. No person earned more than £60,000 during 2017. No trustee received remuneration during the year other than reimbursements incurred solely for minor purchases of provisions and materials for church use.

#### Independent Examiner's Report

Report to the trustees of: Markyate Baptist Church

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner:

As trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (The 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed. As a retired Fellow of the Association of Certified Chartered Accountants 1 consider myself suitably qualified to carry out the independent examination.
