REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2017. The Branch is governed by the RSPCA Rules for Branches effective 18th February 2009. The Trustees who served during the year and up to the date of this report are listed below.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The objectives of the Branch are to promote the work and objects of the RSPCA, with particular reference to the area covered by the Branch, in accordance with the policies of the RSPCA.

Public benefit

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In shaping the Society's objectives and planning our activities, the Trustees have complied with the duty in Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charities Commission.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Essex South West Branch, like all RSPCA branches, is financially independent of the RSPCA. Our income derives mainly from donations, collections, legacies, adoption fees and fund raising events.

In 2017 we continued our policy of limiting our animal welfare activities to a level which results in a more sustainable financial position. Our boarding arrangements for rescued dogs with the Goddard Veterinary Group and for dogs and cats with the RSPCA Danaher Animal Home continue to operate satisfactorily. A total of 41 (2016: 45) dogs were rehomed from Goddards Kennels and 8 (2016: 4) dogs and 26 (2016: 15) cats were sent to the Danaher Home for rehoming by them.

The Branch also provides assistance to members of the public with veterinary bills, where people are on benefits and unable to pay for their pet's treatment.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

A deficit of £10,171 is resulted in the year despite of strict control of our expenditure, compared to a surplus of \pounds 20,455 in 2016. The major items of expenditure remain boarding fees and veterinary costs. Overall income was down by 42% due to a reduction in donations of 20% and there were no legacies and grants received in the year.

There are no restricted funds. Unrestricted funds of £81,480 are general funds to meet ongoing operating expenditure. With the uncertainty in our incoming resources, we have kept our reserve policy to a level that allows resilience and capacity to manage unforeseen financial difficulties.

The Branch has carried out a review to identify major risks and has taken steps to mitigate them. The major risks identified are loss of reputation due to error or fraud, and the availability of sufficient funds to cover the costs of animal welfare activities. It is the opinion of the Trustees that the Branch's policies, procedures and controls are adequate to minimise the possibility of financial loss through error or fraud and to maintain the future financial viability of the Branch.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The Charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

8. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

A payment of £300 was made to a trustee Mrs Patricia Smith for the purchase of a shed and three filing cabinets which were already in use by the branch for a number of years. The Committee has made careful considerations in utilising resources and for the best interests of existing operations, the decision was to purchase of these existing items from this trustee. In addition, the total veterinary bills in respect of fostered dogs amounted to £542.23 were reimbursed to Mrs Smith on behalf of the foster carers during the year.

9. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

A number of trustees left the branch during the year. This had major impacts in operations of all animals rehoming and fundraising activities. The number of trustees remaining with the Branch at the end of the financial year are 5 which is below the RSPCA's Rules for Branches 7.2 the Committee can consist of at least 7. The branch has deployed the service from an existing Animal Welfare Officer from a neighbouring branch on a paid one to two day(s) per week basis. This limits the animal rehoming activities substantially. In order to benefit the public with a wider scope of animals welfare provision, the branch foresees the possibility of a merger with a neighbouring branch in the near future. To proceed by voting by its members, the merger will take place during the year of 2018. The branch will be dissolved with transfer of all assets to a new branch.
