Eversley is a united Benefice with Darby Green and is part of the Group Ministry of Yateley, Darby Green and Eversley

Structure/Governance/Membership of the Parochial Church Council

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is a corporate body established by the Church of England. The PCC operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure. The PCC is registered with the Charity Commission. The day to day management is delegated to the Priest in Charge and Churchwardens.

Members of the PCC are either ex-officio or elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in accordance with the Church Representation Rules. From April 2017 the following people served as members of the PCC and Deanery Synod.

Standing Committee

The committee consists of the Priest, two Churchwardens, Treasurer and one other PCC member and has the power to transact the business of the PCC between meetings.

Music Group

The Choir Management Group and the music group have regular meetings to discuss and select the music to be used in worship in St. Mary's Church.

Life Groups

There are six Life Groups which meet weekly or fortnightly during term time to discuss the bible and to enjoy fellowship together.

Junior Church (Searchers)

Searchers (for children 3-11 years old) meet on second, third and fourth Sundays in the church hall during the 11am services (except the 1st Sunday each month when a Family Service, usually with Baptism, takes place in the church.

Youth Group for secondary school age children met on fourth Sunday evenings in the Church Hall.

Little Lights – a special time for 0-5 year olds and their parents/guardian meet on third Tuesday afternoon for a short worship and then fellowship and refreshments in the hall.

Crèche

The church services are relayed to the tower where there is an unsupervised Crèche area for parents/carers with children under three years old should they wish to use it.

Gratitude

This contemporary service was discontinued in November and a new All Age Service is planned for first Sundays in 2018.

ABC (Adults, Babies & Children)

This group meet each Thursday from 10am - 11.30am during the school terms.

Lunch Club

The lunch club is held on Fridays during term time from 12noon-2pm. This occasion is welcomed by a number of people from the parish of Eversley and beyond.

Events

No events took place during the vacancy but in December the Choir sang Carols at the Kingsley Hotel and the White Hart public house in Eversley.

Objectives and activities

The primary purpose of the PCC is to promote the Gospel according to the doctrines and practises of the Church of England. It is the responsibility of the PCC to cooperate with the priest in charge to promote in the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. The vision of the PCC is @Bringing Hope and Love to the Community'. The Foundation Governors of Charles Kingsley's Church of England (aided) School are appointed by the PCC. The PCC is responsible for the maintenance of St. Mary's Church which is Grade 1 listed and the Church Hall. The PCC also has responsibility for the Rectory Rooms and Bramshill Mission Hall.

During 2017 the PCC met on nine occasions. Once again the PCC fulfilled its obligation to the Winchester Diocese by paying its Common Mission Fund in full. In addition it gave ten per cent of its ordinary income to several charities and there were also some special collections for charity during the year. Shoe boxes were filled during October and November for the Christian charity *Link to Hope* which supports families in four Eastern European countries (Ukraine, Moldova, Bulgaria and Romania). The Maintenance Group looked after the grounds, replaced light bulbs as necessary and did other routine jobs. The Hart Food Bank continued under the local leadership of a member of St. Mary's Church who has the responsibility for organising the volunteers from several churches in the area. The Food Bank is based at St. Barnabas Church, Darby Green which is the other church in our Benefice.

All members of the PCC are volunteers as are the cleaners, flower arrangers, musicians, welcomers, sidesmen/women, the refreshment team and the people who undertake opening/closing the church on a daily basis and the general maintenance of the Church and its environs. The hours spent in administrative, financial, maintenance and other activities by our volunteers cannot be calculated on a monetary scale, but it is invaluable and ensures that the church is able to be open and be well kept, warm and welcoming.
