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Report of the Trustees For The Year Ended 31 December 2017

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Grantmaking

During the course of the year Supporting Dalit Children made 24 grants totalling £160,392.35 to 4 separate causes. The amounts sent to each cause are stated below.

£132,393.69 to the Centre for Non-Formal and Continuing Education for the purposes of financially supporting the Pannur Manvi Mission i.e. Loyola School, Xavier School and Loyola College (all in Manvi), and Loyola Kapepaladi School, hostel and school bus service in Pannur.

£5,608.59 to the Pannur Health Centre in the village of Pannur, run by the Sisters of St Joseph's of Tarbes, for the primary health care of both the Dalit children attending Loyola Kapepaladi School and the Dalit communities living in the surrounding villages.

£8,680.07 to Mangalore Jesuit Educational Society for helping the slum children at Panchanadi slum in Mangalore, for assisting in further education fees and providing emergency health care funding for a girl called Annapurna.

£13,710.00 to North Karnataka Jesuit Education and Charitable Society, for the purchasing and installation of a children's playground at the Mundgod Mission in Mundgod.

A Christmas Clothing Appeal was launched to buy a new outfit of clothing for all 310 students at Loyola Kapepaladi School, Pannur.

An emergency Health Appeal was launched to help raise the necessary funds for treating a girl called Annapurna who was suffering with Acute Myelitis.

A total of 9 sewing machines were bought for the Tailoring Project in 2017.

The charity is run voluntarily i.e. no salaries are paid whatsoever. Trustees and their families fund all office running expenses and all travel expenses to India. Therefore expenses are kept to a minimum. In 2017 expenses totalled £1,805.70. The expenses consisted of reprinting 6 charity Christmas card designs, the printing of charity Newsletters, Accountancy costs and the purchase of a Silver Bond place in the London Marathon up until 2022.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

Individual sponsorship increased throughout the year in Loyola Kapepaladi School.

Supporting Dalit Children is unilaterally supporting the running costs of Kapepaladi School in Pannur through sponsorships, fundraising, individual donations and donations from charitable trusts.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees consider it prudent that unrestricted reserves should be sufficient to cover advance sums needed for the preliminary booking of the next fund raising event. The level of reserves is monitored and reviewed by the trustees throughout the year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity's objects and regulations are regulated by a trust deed dated 8th May 2008, and under that Deed is constituted as a charitable trust. It is a registered charity, number 1125102.

The trust deed provides for three trustees - the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of Supporting Dalit Children. Were there a requirement for new trustees, these would be recommended and agreed by the existing trustees.

Notes to the Financial Statements For The Year Ended 31 December 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
