The Trustees present their report and the accounts for the year ended 31^{st} December 2017. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the charity's trust deed, applicable law and the requirements of the Charity Commission.

Structure, Governance and management

The League of Friends of the Queen Victoria Hospital, which was constituted in 1949, was registered with the Charity Commission under no. 215518 on 31st January 1963. The Governing Document is the Rules and Constitution approved 29th May 1961 as amended by resolution passed 17th June 1963. Its address on the Charity Commissioners Report is c/o 7, Sheridan Place, East Grinstead, West Sussex, RH19 1SU.

Under their Constitution the activities of the League of Friends are co-ordinated by a Committee of Trustees whose powers and responsibilities are defined in the Governing Document. The Trustees also decide on the general policy to be adopted in the pursuance of the objectives of the Friends.

The Charity employed no members of staff during 2017.

Objects and activities

To mobilise, encourage, foster and maintain the interest in the patients and support the work of the Queen Victoria Hospital in East Grinstead.

The Charity's main purpose, as set out in the governing document, is to raise funds to provide amenities for patients and staff at the Queen Victoria Hospital.

Achievements and performance

The League's gross income, compared with that of £52,742 in 2016 was higher at £55038 in 2017. Income consisted mainly of Legacy & Donation income and increased Bank Interest and Investment Income due to the Trustees efforts to manage its available funds. Despite the Government's continuing NHS Reforms and restructuring of the Hospital the league has provided substantial assistance to the Hospital during the year. The League expects to provide a greater level of assistance in 2018.

Direct Charitable Expenditure totaled £78,862 (the details of which are set out on page 6). During 2017 the League's overall net resources including investments held increased to $\pounds 1,172,961$ of which an estimated sum of at least £500,000 will be spent on assistance to the Hospital during 2018

The continued view of the Trustees is that because of the low level of regular income, the League will act prudently during 2018 when considering the purchase of equipment etc. for the Hospital. Having reviewed the funding requests from the hospital the trustees have agreed to assist the hospital in purchasing a CT Scanner which will greatly benefit the local community, patients and staff. Almost certainly the League's regular income will be exceeded by expenditure. The trustees feel that the new equipment to be funded in 2018 is a necessity and will provide a benefit to the local community.

Public Benefit

The charity's trustees have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's general guidance on Public Benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning its future activities. In particular, they have considered how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

The League of Friends of The Queen Victoria Hospital has continued its charitable work throughout the year providing new and improved equipment to the Hospital with a total spend of $\pounds76,935$. This included the provision of a 3D Scanning Facility, a Hydrogen Peroxide Decontamination Unit and Furniture for the Hurricane Cafe. The Hospital caters for the medical needs of the general public and to this end the contribution of the charity has enabled the Hospital to provide an improved service.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the receipts and payments guidance issued by the Charity Commission.

1.2 Incoming resources

Donations and legacies, subscriptions, income in furtherance of the charities objectives and income to generate funds are included in the year in which they are receivable which is when the charity becomes entitled to the resource.

Income from investments is included in the statement of financial activities in the year in which it is receivable.

1.3 Resources expended

Expenditure is included when incurred. Costs are attributable to either direct charitable expenditure which include grants approved and paid to Queen Victoria Hospital for either hospital equipment or related hospital running costs.

Support costs include office running costs and governence costs which are those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity such as the Independent Examination.

Gifts in kind - The charity receives the benefit of work carried out by volunteers.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £500 are capitalised.

1.5 Accumulated Funds

The nature and purpose of each fund is shown in notes 11 and 12

1.6 Taxation

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As a registered Charity the Association is exempt from Income Tax and Capital Gains Tax but not from VAT. The League was registered for VAT in February 2003 but applied for and received deregistration in March 2008.
