STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Mothers' Union is an Anglican organisation which promotes the well-being of families worldwide. The charity is governed by a constitution approved on 3 November 2003 and updated on 10 July 2012. The Trustees control and manage the affairs of the charity in the Diocese.

Trustees are recruited by the existing board when a vacancy occurs.

Reserves Policy

The charity has established a policy whereby the surplus funds not otherwise committed should be the equivalent of one year's expenditure. We consider that the equivalent of 12 months resources will give the charity sufficient funds to continue our current activities in the event of a significant reduction in funding

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The aim and objectives of the Mothers' Union is the advancement of Christian religion in the sphere of marriage and family life and to be specially concerned with all that strengthens and preserves marriage and Christian family life.

The Trustees have examined the major risks to which the charity is exposed and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to those major risks.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Throughout 2017 MU York Diocese has upheld the aims and objectives in many various ways; branch fellowship, deaconry and archdeaconry festivals, two diocesan meetings, coffee mornings, strawberry teas, community drop in sessions and toddler groups.

MUe representatives have promoted the work of the Mothers' Union with every card they have sold. The cards identify all the projects, national and international, the charity is supporting.

Our AFIA (Away From It All) caravan provides much needed holidays for disadvantaged families who would not otherwise be able to afford to get away from the pressures of daily life. These holidays are probably the only time families get to have quality time together and they provide positive memories to sustain them through the hard times they face just trying to live out their daily lives.

Many members are involved with Prison Work; a welcoming face whilst families are waiting to visit their prison inmate. Members look after the children in a safe and friendly environment whilst the visit takes place. This enables both parents and children to take away good quality memories from what otherwise could be a very stressful situation.

Pocket crosses are given to the wider community in numerous ways such as; at weddings, baptisms, members of the armed forces (Yorkshire Regiment in particular), even fans of football teams. In Escrick, York, local primary school children are given holding crosses by the members of the Escrick branch on moving onto Secondary School.

Many members produce knitted garments for refugees entering this area as well as baby items for premature babies and twiddle muffs for use with Dementia patients. In one or two areas in the Diocese members work closely with a Woman's refuge providing basic toiletry/make up packs.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Parenting courses are being planned to assist families to enjoy a more fulfilling family life. These courses are run with the aim of teaching facilitators to run their own parenting courses in their local areas.

Using MULOA (Mothers' Union Listening, Observing, Acting) process to ascertain the priorities of the members and help guide the next 5 years of strategy both Diocesan and National.

Overseas links are maintained throughout the year with our link dioceses by our dedicated Overseas Link Correspondent. Midday prayers are said by members daily across the whole diocese which includes our local, national and international links.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is 12 Sir John Hunt Cottages, Fulford Road, Fulford, York, YO10 4PG.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities. The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

(b) Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

(c) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objects of the charity. Restricted funds are funds which can only be used for a particular restricted purpose within the objects of the charity.

(d) Incoming resources

All income is included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.

- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

(e) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources expended (continued)

- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.

- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

(f) Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.

(g) Investments

Investments are a form of basic financial instrument and are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at their fair value as at the balance sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The statement of financial activities includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluation and disposals throughout the year.

The main form of financial risk faced by the charity is that of volatility in equity markets and investment markets due to wider economic conditions, the attitudes of investors to investment risk, and changes in sentiment concerning equities and within particular sectors or sub sectors.

(h) Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost includes all costs of purchase, costs of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the stock to its present location and condition.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued)

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(i) Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.
