ANNUAL TRUSTEES REPORT - 2016/2017

SANAS has again had a good year in terms of extending our reach within the community. We have seen an increase in our supporters, particularly in our regular cook-ups and are delighted that these are at the heart of what we do – bringing people together.

OUR VISION and AIMS

Our vision is to have a strong united community in and around Slough, where people work in partnership to enhance the quality of life for themselves and others. Our aims are to:

- · Support local nationals and the wider community
- · Work towards improving health and well-being
- · Bring families and communities together
- Build community partnerships
- Manage a community cafe

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS

SANAS has had a busy year with a focus on our priorities. We have achieved the following:

- Maintaining links with the High Commission and national organisations. This gives us the opportunity to share best practice and hear what other St Kitts & Nevis organisations around the country are doing.
 We also offer our support by attending their activities where possible.
- Teamwork: We have a strong team in place, which has enabled us to continue with the vital work. The
 development of the subcommittees has been a real asset.
- Strengthening partnerships with local stakeholders. Since becoming a SPACE associate in June 2016, SANAS has been able to work in collaboration and receive information and advice. SPACE is a consortium of local charities, Slough Council for Voluntary Service, Royal Voluntary Service, Slough Community Transport and Slough Crossroads. The advantages of being a SPACE associate is that SANAS will have access to information and services and increase awareness in what we do. As a SPACE associate, SANAS' activities are monitored and reviewed on a quarterly basis.
- Older people and hidden carers: SANAS is delighted to have been rewarded a grant to build on our
 existing activities. This will be to extend our reach to older people and further build on our Saturday
 lunch club offering. As part of this activity, we provide free transportation and a subsidised meal and
 drink. All of which helps with health and wellbeing and loneliness to our supporters.
- Have fun! Although we work hard and have little time for fun, we value the importance of team work
 and will continue to go on training courses and workshops to enable us to deliver against our objectives,
 achieve our goals and strengthen as a team.

MEMBERSHIP

Decreasing number of members is a challenge. However, the number of supporters has increased. Our regular cook-ups continue to enable us to reach out to more nationals than ever and it is great to see people of all ages enjoying not only the fine food, but the healthy discussions, debates and company that these cook-ups bring.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Executive Committee has agreed to change SANAS' reporting year end from 1st October to 30th September to 1st January to 31st December — which will make reporting easier. We are pleased to report that SANAS has had a good year. We have seen an increase in the number of donations from supporters and income from events and activities held throughout the year. SANAS has once again received funding to support our Saturday lunch club for older people and a contribution towards the Celebrate Chalvey event which was held in October. Our key source of funds is from our bi-monthly Cook-ups. We are pleased to report that this is a very popular event for those who attend and for those who place take-away orders and continues to grow in popularity.

We are also pleased to report that the association has been able to make donations to Cancer Research and St Andrews Methodist Church.

1 Accounting Policies

Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards, and the Charities Accounting Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) in so far as they are appropriate.

Stocks

Stocks of drinks, liquorand food are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value on a first in first out basis (F.I.F.O) having regard for the shelf life of the goods.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for the use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the association.

Restricted funds are subjected to restriction on their expenditure imposed by the granting body, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs.

Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included on an accruals basis insofar as it can be qualified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources Expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been allocated accordingly. When costs cannot be directly attributed to a particular activity or heading they have been allocated to activities on the basis of consistent use of the resource.

Governance costs include those costs related to meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the association in line with best practice.

Project Events (P)

Where events are undertaken with a view to be non profit orientated they will be classified as Project Events.

Fundraising Events (F)

Events which are undertaken to raise and increase the general funds of the association are classified as Fundraising Events.
