Report of the trustees For the year ended 31 October 2017

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity operates primarily from its correspondence address.

Trustees are trained in their duties informally and inducted by their fellow committee members in the duties and responsibilities of a Trustee.

Oxford and District Mencap is affiliated to the Royal Mencap Society.

Risk Assessment

The Trustees have examined the major strategies, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to minimise these risks.

Objective and Activities

To work for the benefit of children and adults with a learning disability and in particular to promote their care, treatment and education and to secure for them provision commensurate with their needs and to support their parents and other carers.

During the year, the Charity received total income of £56,082 and incurred total expenditure of £58,415 creating a deficit of £2,333 for the year as detailed in the attached accounts. The fund balances totalling £15,920 are required to finance the continuing activities of the Charity.

The Trustees are grateful to the charities, schools and the church listed on page 12, for their support, mainly maintaining the grants made in the previous years.

Reserves policy

Trustees' Responsibilities

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of the Charity and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that period. In preparing those statements the trustees are required to:-

-select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;

-make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

-follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;

-prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Charity will continue.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy, at any time, the financial position of the Charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 1993 and the Constitution. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

We report on the accounts of the Oxford and District Mencap for the year ended 31st October 2017

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
