TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2017

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2017, which have been prepared in compliance with the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard FRS 102.

Structure, Governance & Management

The Charity is governed by a Trust Deed dated 16th December 1955, constituted as a Charitable Trust.

The trustee is the Worshipful Company of Distillers, represented by its Court of Assistants.

Objectives and Activities

The activities of the charity places philanthropy at the heart of the work of our Livery. The trustees confirm they have referred to The Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and settling its grant making policy.

Our mission is to make a difference to young people and to those in need by improving alcohol education, providing training and vocational opportunities for those in the trade and supporting The Master's, The Lord Mayor's and other Livery related causes.

There were no exceptional fund raising activities. The charity received regular income by way of donations from the Livery and from its investment portfolio, which has enabled the charity to continue to fund its customary donations. Our activities in 2017 focused on three main areas supporting a total of 14 charities:

- Alcohol related education: Organisations funded during the year included the Alcohol Education Trust, a charity that helps parents and teachers to inform children about alcohol. We also supported The Benevolent who combat challenging social issues within the drinks trade. The charity supported a bursary for a person to receive treatment for addiction at Action on Addiction's residential treatment centre in Clapham.
- Scholarships and support for people in the trade: this included a scholarship at the Heriot-Watt International Centre for Brewing and Distilling and three further scholarships at the Institute of Brewing and Distilling. Two scholarships are also awarded to students obtaining high marks in the spirits section of the WSET's Diploma examinations.
- During this year the Master's charity of the year was London Music Masters, supporting the involvement of young people in classical music. We also contributed to the Lord Mayor's appeal. Other City-related charities supported include St Lawrence Jewry Church (the venue for the Distillers' Carol Service) and the City & Guilds (which makes vocational awards). A donation was made to a Livery wide appeal in support of the Grenfell Tower disaster in Kensington.

During 2017 key financial highlights included the following;

- Liverymen increased their donations to £48,356, including gift aid.
- Distillers' Charity Endowment, including investments and cash, grew to £889,352.
- Distillers' Charity's donations to good causes totalled £41,550.

Future Plans

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> Distillers' Charity expects to continue its activities in support of its philanthropic mission into future years and has implemented a programme of increased communications to encourage greater engagement with its donors in order to provide further support to its charitable causes.

Reserves Policy

The Unrestricted Fund is to use both capital and income to maintain and augment its objectives.

The present level of reserves are deemed necessary in order to generate sufficient income to fund future regular donations and scholarships.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2017

1. Accounting Policies

These accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention (except investments which are shown at market value) in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. No restatement of comparative items was required upon the transition to FRS 102.

a) Recognition of Income

Income is recognised once the charity has entitlement, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income can be measured reliably.

Investment income is recognised upon notification from the Investment advisor of the dividends due.

b) Recognition of Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised, on an accruals basis, as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure.

Grants payable are accrued when the charity committee has resolved to make unconditional payment to the beneficiary.

c) Fixed Asset Investments

Investments are included at market value at the year end. Gains and losses on revaluation and disposals are included in the Statement of Financial Activities.
