In determining the means by which the Trust shall achieve its object, the trustees have had regard to the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission. During the year under review the Trust awarded 38 Grants ranging in value from £250.00 to £5,000.00 to a range of charitable organisations. In the opinion of the trustees the Trust, by making grants only to charitable organisations which are themselves for the benefit of the public, is fulfilling its own obligation to deliver public benefit in the furtherance of its object. The sum of £24,481.00 has been expended from the endowment funds and for Charity Commission accounting purposes is now classed as income.
