1 Notes to the Accounts

The financial statements of the PCC have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 using the Receipts and Payments basis.

2 Fixed Assets

Consecrated and benefice property is not included from the accounts by s.10(2)(a)&(C) of the Charities Act 2011.

Moveable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are inalienable property, listed in the Church's inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For anything acquired prior to 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements.

Other tangible fixed asssts are valued at cost.

3 Descripton of Funds

Unrestricted funds are income funds of the PCC that are available for spending on the general purposes of the PCC, including amounts designated by the PCC for fixed assets for its own use or for spending on a future project and which are therefore not included in its "free reserves" as disclosed in the trustees' annual report.

Restricted funds comprise of two elements :-

- a) income from trusts or endowments which may be expended only on those restricted objects provided in the terms of the trust or bequest
- b) donations or grants received for a specific object or invited by the PCC for a specific object. The funds may only be expended on the specific object for which they were given. Any balance remaining unspent at the end of each year must be carried forward as a balance on that fund. The PCC does not usually invest separately for each fund. Where there is no separate investment, interest is apportioned to individual funds on an average balance basis.

Endowment funds are restricted funds that must be retained as trust capitalei the permanently or subject to a discretionary power to spend capital as income, and where the use of any income or other benefit derived from the capital may be restricted or unrestricted. Full details of all their restrictions are shown in the notes to the accounts.

2017 Annual Report of St. Anne's Church in the Parish of Chasetown

Background

St Anne's Church is situated in Church Street, Chasetown. The correspondence address is St Anne's Church, Church Street, Chasetown, Burntwood, Staffs WS7 3QL.

St Anne's Parochial Church Council (PCC) has the responsibility of co-operating with the Team Vicar, Revd. Richard Westwood and the Team Rector Revd. Margaret Mattocks in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church: pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the church.

St Anne's Church is served by the Chasetown Parish Ministry Leadership Team which, during 2017 underwent a number of changes: Mrs Joan Mullins and Mrs Kathleen Edgerton (Authorised Lay Ministers) both decided to not seek the renewal of their licenses, although they are still involved in prayer and pastoral ministry within the life of the church. Sadly, Mr Philip Stratton, (Reader) having renewed his license to minister, decided to leave the church fellowship after many years of membership and fruitful service. St Anne's PCC wishes to offer heartfelt thanks to Joan, Kath and Phil, for their faithful service and commitment over many years and wishes them well in their continuing ministry and discipleship.

As a result of these changes, the Chasetown Parish Ministry Leadership comprises only The Revd. Richard Westwood (Team Vicar) and The Revd. David Brook (retired minister with Bishops Permission to Officiate). In order to address the need for increased lay ministry in the PCC was pleased that a 'Learning to Lead' course operated during 2017, where opportunity was given for church members to receive training in leading services and preaching. The need for greater lay ministry was increased in October 2017 when Revd Linda Hood (Non-Stipendiary Minister at Hammerwich) stepped down from her role. The PCC wishes to record its thanks to Linda for her ministry amongst the people of Chasetown and wishes her well in her retirement.

Church attendance

There are 99 members on the Church Electoral Roll of St Anne's Church, 44 (45%) of whom are resident outside the parish. The usual Sunday attendance at St. Anne's was 67 adults and 7 children, but this number increased for the major festivals. The 1st Sunday of the month has been an all age non-eucharistic service. On this 1st Sunday there is a Holy Communion Service in the evening.

The attendances at the annual Carol Service and the Christmas Eve Nativity Service were very encouraging, as is the participation in a regular monthly Messy Church. The pattern of Church services changed in October 2017 to accommodate the needs of Churches across the Benefice following the retirement of Linda Hood.

Review of the year

The full PCC met 10 times during the year. The meetings were very well attended and a good portion of the business of PCC involved planning for the future mission of the church and development of the church building. The PCC also held and open meeting with all members of the church invited to discuss some of the plans for the development of St Anne's church building

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Significant events in the year included the beginning of a weekly 'Place of Welcome' drop in coffee morning for all in the Parish of Chasetown. The monthly Messy Church, which aims to help children and young families worship together, has continued to thrive. The weekly carers and toddlers group 'Ladybirds' and the parent and child buggy walking group 'Strollers' are also well attended and are valued by members of the wider community. This work amongst children and families means that the size of our worshipping community has grown. The PCC thanks all who are involved in this work for the time, care and energy which they put into these parts of the life of the church. Small groups for prayer, Bible study and fellowship are now well established and are appreciated by all who attend. It is encouraging to note that the church ran two START courses for those wanting to find out more about the Christian faith and that six people from St Anne's decided to be confirmed during the year. Many church members attended a Quiet Day at Colwich Abbey and the PCC thanks Joan Mullins for her role in leading this. The PCC also wishes to thank the musicians and singers who help to organise and lead sung worship in the church, especially Yvonne Griffin, Jean Spraggett and Gerald Harvey.

During 2017 the church began to revise and improve its record keeping for the closed churchyard and is working with Lichfield District Council to help manage the churchyard in partnership with a local 'friends of the churchyard' group.

St Anne's Church building has benefitted from the instalment of external low energy (LED) Passive Infra Red security lighting which should reduce energy and maintenance costs and help to ensure the safety of users of the building at night time. The grounds of the church are cared for by Mr Roy Woodward, who together with Mr Terry Smith oversees the practical care of the church building. The PCC extends its thanks to Terry and Roy for this significant work and commitment

The PCC is indebted to the Churchwardens who have served in 2017, Carol Thomas and Sheila Murphy. Their hard work and dedication is much appreciated and the church thanks them warmly for all they have given in their service to God in this role especially whilst the Team Vicar, Revd Richard Westwood was on extended study leave for three months. Grateful thanks are also offered to Ministers from the benefice and from across the diocese who came to assist with services during this time. The PCC thanks Anita Brookes for her commitment and hard work in her role as PCC secretary and website manager and also thanks Ken Scott- Clegg, Angela Buckley and Tony Slater for their work on the Church's giving and finances.

St Anne's continues to support a number of charitable organisations and in 2017 donations were made to Macmillan Cancer Care, The Children's Society (through the collection from the Christingle Service), Hands at Work in Africa, Pathway Project, MAF, Action Aid, CMS and the Link for Life Project. In total St Anne's donated £2,929 to charity, shared between local, national and international good causes.

Financial Review

During the year £85,129 (2016 £82,559) was spent to provide the Christian ministry in Chasetown parish, including £42,370 (2016 £39,529) as the contribution to the diocesan quota, which largely provides the stipends and housing for the clergy. The net result for the year was an excess of receipts over payments of +£2,884 (2016 was a balance of +£15,232). The main features of this excess (despite increased costs was) an increase in giving from the regular members of the church, much of which was focused around a gift day. This response from the congregation is wonderful and the PCC wishes to thank all members of the church who gave in such a generous way. As a result of this the PCC has been able to pay its parish share quota in full and by monthly standing order and also increase the amount it gives away to mission and charities. The PCC is grateful to have received grants from Burntwood Town Council (£250) towards the costs of the Ladybirds Carer and Toddler Group and from We Love Lichfield (a fund managed by Lichfield District Council (£700) towards the cost associated with the start of the weekly 'Place of Welcome' Drop-In In addition to the full payment of the 2016 Parish Share the PCC reached an agreement with the Lay Assessors of Lichfield Diocese to bring about the cancellation of a significant part of the historic arrears of unpaid parish share. The PCC acknowledges and thanks God for the continued health in its finances during this year and looks forward to making plans for further growth in the months and years ahead.
