Trustees' Report

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2018. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charities trust deed, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Structure, governance and management

The Society is a registered charity, number 296085 and is constituted and governed by Society rules. The charities principal activity during the year continued to be advancing the study of French Porcelain of all periods and to further public knowledge and appreciation of it .

Trustees are appointed by members of the society. Voting takes place annually at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) usually held in June. Trustees are eligible for reappointment every year at the AGM and remain in office, until either their position is challenged or they resign. A current list of trustees and their roles is contained in the information page.

Financial Review

The society is self-funding and in addition to income raised via membership subscriptions, Seminars and visits are organised each year to enable appreciation of French Porcelain.

The general fund is unrestricted and are spent as Trustees see fit for purpose to meet the aims of the Society.

The Special fund, Publications fund, Mavis Watney Bequest and Sir Geoffrey de Bellaige Bequest are all restricted funds and monies are spent in accordance with the each fund's purpose.

Main Objectives

The main objective of the society is to further the study and appreciation of French Porcelain of all periods. The trustees confirm that they have given due regard to the guidance published by the Charities Commission on public benefit in deciding what activities the Society undertakes.

Aims are fulfilled with an active programme of lectures, symposia and visits to collections both within the UK and abroad. Scholarly journals and newsletters are also produced to help achieve the Society's aims.

Trustees' Report

A new website has transformed the Society's on-line presence, and is a window on the Society's study days, handling sessions, visits to museums and collectors, publications and visits. It is also an introduction to our subject, with sections on the French porcelain factories, ceramic materials and techniques, and marks, and links to collections and societies around the world. Over thirty new members have joined the Society since its launch in July 2017.

An important part of the Society's work is supporting new scholarship in the field of French porcelain, and European ceramics more widely and several bursaries to younger scholars were awarded during 2017.

This principal academic event was the symposium 'St Cloud to Bernardaud', convened by Dr Aileen Dawson and held over two days in October at the Wallace Collection. It was organised to showcase new research on the many, mostly smaller, French porcelain factories which operated largely outside royal or state control. At times overshadowed by the royal manufactory at Sèvres, some of these factories have recently received attention from a new generation of scholars, especially in France. The symposium provided an opportunity to hear about their work, some of which is currently unpublished. The two days were a wide-ranging survey of French porcelain manufacture from the late 17th century, taking in the 18th century factories of Mennecy, Villeroy, Chantilly, Strasbourg and Niderviller, and those of Dihl and Dagoty in Paris. Also covered were the exhibition and manufacture of porcelain in 19th century Paris, collecting French porcelain in the later 19th century, and the technical brilliance and creativity of Limoges today.

Another development was a programme of evening seminars. Held once a quarter these comprise short talks and the opportunity to discuss and handle objects.

The Society's biennial Journal is now fully peer-reviewed.

Accounting and reporting responsibilities

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing an annual report and financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and UK GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Practice). The Charities Act 2011 requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to;

- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue as a going concern

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the applicable Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations and the provisions of the trust deed. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Standard of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has an entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received and the monetary value of the incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability
