13<sup>th</sup> March 2016 - Manchester Amateur Choral Competition

The Cluster Choir who had won this competition in 2015 performed a twenty minute slot as the reigning champions. Youth Voices also competed. No trophy but excellent feedback from the judges.

19<sup>th</sup> March 2016 – Choir of the year auditions.

The Cluster choir got through to the national selection round. The Accidentals did very well but did not go through to the next round.

22<sup>nd</sup> March – The Cluster choir and Youth Voices were guests at a charity raising function and raised £1059 for Macmillan Cancer Support.

16<sup>th</sup> April – The Accidentals took part in a fundraising concert with the Lichfield Concert Band at the Coton Centre, Tamworth.

7<sup>th</sup> May – The Cluster Choir performed with The Birmingham Canolidir Male Choir.

18<sup>th</sup> June 2016 – Annual Showcase Concert. The highlight of our year when all of our choirs performed at the Birmingham Conservatoire.

16<sup>th</sup> July – Llangollen Eisteddfod. The Cluster and Youth Voices entered but not placed this time.

November 2016 – the Cluster and Youth Voices raised over £1000 in concert for NSPCC.

7<sup>th</sup> December 2016 – The Training Choir and Cluster sang in concert at Lichfield Cathedral.

11<sup>th</sup> December 2016 – Family Christmas Concert at Sutton Coldfield Town Hall with Cluster Choir and Accidentals together with Sutton Coldfield Orchestra.

26<sup>th</sup> February 2017 – Manchester Amateur Choral Competition Accidentals had excellent feedback from judges but no prize this time!

#### SCC Choirs CIO Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 28<sup>th</sup> February 2017

#### 1. ACCOUNTING PERIOD

The Charity was formed on the 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2016 and took over activities on the 1<sup>st</sup> March 2016 from a previous Charity Sutton Coldfield Choirs (registered charity number 1162378). The accumulated funds from the previous charity were taken over by SCC Choirs CIO as at that date.

#### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
