A talk in the church on the proposed restoration of the organ by a local organist initiated the very successful "sponsor a Pipe" scheme. Donations now totalling over £8,000.

The Friends managed a FunDay for the church and raised £1,513.37 this amount was passed to the church.

The annual fundraising Christmas concert took place on 2/12/17. This raised £2,304.58

Further friends were enrolled and the total Subscription income was £1,200.53.

Reports of Friends activities were published in the Winkfield Parish News, a monthly journal.
