DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD 1 MAY TO 31 DECEMBER 2017

Annual Accounts: The Classical Road Show (CRS) Trustees decided, and Companies House and The Charity Commission were informed, that in future, our annual accounts would contain results from 1 January to end of December. These interim accounts therefore represent the period 1 May – 31 December 2017 only.

Concerts: In June 2017, the CRS promoted in Trinity School, Croydon two performances of *Zambezi Tales*, a long-standing and popular piece in their repertoire, featuring folk tales handed down orally by generations of the Shona and Tonga tribes who lived on the Zambezi river. The composer is Richard Brown, with words by Nigel Williams.

The CRS is grateful to Trinity School for making their concert hall available for their concerts during the two-year rebuilding of Fairfield Halls. Just under 1,000 children participated in song, accompanied by the London Mozart Players conducted by Hilary Davan Wetton. Concert narrators in brilliant comedic form were Clive Rowe, Jacqui Dankworth and Annabelle Brown. The Mayor of Croydon, Councillors and concert sponsors were among their welcome guests, who included Pinky Lilani CBE DL.

In October 2017, CRS promoted the same concert piece in the City of London, with the same accomplished cast, but with Rosalie Craig replacing Jacqui Dankworth, The two concerts were held in Milton Court, Barbican as before, in association with the Guildhall School of Music (GSMD), whose musicians shared the platform side-by-side with the London Mozart Players. GSMD expressed their students' enjoyment in sharing orchestral desks with these experienced and collaborative players. Approx. 1,300 children on stage and in audience seats performed robustly and impressed the many City leaders who attended as guests.

'Twilight' Workshops were held by the Conductor for Teachers of participating schools. They were held a few months in advance of each concert day, allowing time to explore the music, highlight exceptional passages and ensure a consistent approach. These workshops were highly successful and strengthened CRS ties with schools and teachers.

These two concerts completed the Classical Road Show's 30th season of concerts and the Company again paid tribute to its Founder/ Conductor, Hilary Davan Wetton, for his inspirational direction of these educational projects, which since 1988 have given musical aspirations to c. 75,000 children. Hilary has stepped down as Conductor but continues as Musical Director, which is greatly appreciated by the CRS.

New Commission: The CRS was delighted to commission a new piece for performance by massed choirs of children, narrators and professional orchestra by Richard Brown (composer), Fern Dickson and Sarah Harding (script & lyrics): *Battle of Britain: our finest hour.* The subject was chosen after consultation with a number of Primary Schools and will be premiered by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra in Cadogan Hall in March 2018, conducted by Ben Glassberg.

CRS future conductors: The Trustees are delighted to have appointed three conductors who share the ethic and purpose of these unusual concerts for children 7-11yrs and bring their great gifts to them. They are (in order of appearance) Ben Glassberg, Ben Pope and Karin Hendrickson. We look forward to happy collaborations with them.

Financial Support: The CRS is most grateful to Delancey and to Ares for their joint sponsorship of the Croydon concert: also to the HR Taylor Trust for their support and to Croydon Council who supplied transport grants to some schools. They also express their sincere thanks to The Mercers' Company, The Schroder Foundation and The Belvedere Trust for their joint support of the City concert. They acknowledge with thanks funding for the new commission by M&G, The Joyce Grenfell Memorial Trust, Sandra Charitable Trust and an anonymous donor. They continue to be most grateful to Studio 108, who for many years have designed pro bono all the concerts' publicity and programme material.

Results for the period

As reported in the last accounts, funds were transferred from 'Unrestricted Funds' to cover last year's shortfall. In principle, CRS arranges concerts that break even, attracting sponsorship and donations which permit schools' tickets to be heavily subsidised. Identification of our future, financial commitments, listed on the Balance Sheet, continues to ensure that events undertaken do not prejudice the financial status of the Company/ Charity, in accordance with our Reserves Policy. Financial support received in one year for the following year is itemised at the bottom of the Statement of Financial Activities and is included in the Balance Sheet.
