#### Structure, governance and management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules 2006. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and to stand for election to the PCC.

#### PCC's responsibilities

The PCC are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The Charities Act 2011 requires the PCC to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Church and its financial activities for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the PCC members are required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- b) make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation

The PCC are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Church and enable them to ascertain the financial position of the Church and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

# CHURCH OF ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST, RANMOOR ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2017

The PCC members confirm that so far as they are aware, there is no relevant information of which the Church's independent examiners are unaware. They have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as PCC members in order to make themselves aware of any relevant information and to establish that the charity's independent examiners are aware of that information.

#### Objectives and activities

St John the Evangelist's PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the Vicar, Reverend Canon Neil Bowler, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Church Building and grounds of St John the Evangelist, Ranmoor Park Road Ranmoor, Sheffield, S10 3GX.

#### Electoral roll

There are 230 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll. 14 names were added during the year, 6 were removed, 2 died and 2 moved away.

#### Review of the year

There were significant changes at St John's during 2017, the resignation in the summer of Reverend Canon Neil Bowler and a new Director of Music, Edward Barbieri, being appointed, were just two. But as the summer moved into autumn, a piece of Victorian ceiling fell to the ground; fortunately, no-one was in church at the time. This led to the closure of the building because no-one could be certain why the piece had fallen. So, we ended the year in an interregnum and having the Bishop's permission to hold public worship in the Ranmoor Parish Centre.

Following several years of discussion, new gas boilers were installed and automatic fans replaced the need to keep the external doors in the basement open 24/7; including throughout the winter months. We also continued to undertake the works identified in our 2014 Quinquennial Inspection, removed the ivy from the south side of the church building and undertook essential maintenance on the trees in our churchyard.

Throughout the difficult period in the latter part of the year, we received fantastic support from clergy to lead our worship, Diocesan staff to help us through complex legal issues – mainly to do with weddings that had been arranged – and, most importantly, members of our own congregation who have responded to the challenges that arise during an interregnum and the closure of a church building.

Also, in September we were fortunate to be able to celebrate Caroline Hartley becoming an Authorised Lay Children's Minister and Alison Wragg starting the second year of her training to become a Reader. Well done both.

Finally, the most important aspect of life at St John's is the presence of God in our lives. There are many ways in which people demonstrate their faith through their work or as volunteers; thank you to you all.

#### Financial review

Total incoming resources on unrestricted funds were £214,578 (2016 £201,467) and resources expended were £257,398 (2016 £179,592) leaving a defecit on unrestricted funds for the year of £42,820 (2016 Surplus £21,875).

#### Reserves policy

It is PCC policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), which equates to approximately six months' unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The balance of £347,032 on unrestricted funds at the year-end exceeded this target.

#### Responsibilities and basis of report

As the trustees of the charity you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's financial statements carried out under section 145 of the Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.

An independent examination does not involve gathering all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently does not cover all the matters that an auditor considers in giving their opinion on the financial statements. The planning and conduct of an audit goes beyond the limited assurance that an independent examination can provide. Consequently I express no opinion as to whether the financial statements present a 'true and fair' view and my report is limited to those specific matters set out in the independent examiner's statement.

#### **Independent Examiner's Statement**

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2017

#### 1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP 2005.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value.

#### **Funds**

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also unrestricted.

Restricted funds are those funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions are provided in note 9. Endowment funds, where the capital must be retained, are explained in note 10b.

The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the financial statements of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

#### Incoming resources

#### Voluntary income and capital sources

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC.

Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received.

Tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised when the donation is recognised.

Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the PCC is reasonably certain.

Funds raised by concerts and similar events are accounted for gross.

Sales of books and magazines from the church bookstall are accounted for gross.

#### Other income

Rental income from the letting of church premises is recognised when the rental is due.

#### Income from investments

Dividends are accounted for when due and payable, and interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

#### Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold.

Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December.

#### Resources used

#### Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding obligation on the PCC.

#### Activities directly relating to the work of the Church

The diocesan parish share is accounted for when due. Any parish share unpaid at 31 December is provided for in these financial statements as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the balance sheet.

#### **Fixed assets**

#### Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the financial statements by s.10(2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

Movable church furnishings held by the vicar and churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are accounted for as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the Church's inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to 2006 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements. Items acquired since 1 January 2006 have been capitalised and depreciated in the financial statements over their currently anticipated useful economic life.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2017

#### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

#### Consecrated property and movable church furnishings (continued)

All expenditure incurred in the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under £1,000 or on the repair of movable church furnishings acquired before 1 January 2006 is written off.

#### Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight-line basis over four years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

#### Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December.

#### **Current assets**

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectable.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church of England Funds or at the bank.

#### 11 Contingent Liability

In October 2017, following a fall of masonry from the underside of the nave ceiling, St John's church was closed for safety reasons. Scaffolding was erected in December 2017 to facilitate the inspection of the 330 ceiling panels in the nave and side aisles. Interim costs incurred in the calendar year 2017 accounts amounted to £26,257 (per note 4).

Following discussions with our architect, the Diocesan Advisory Committee and others we are expecting to be able to issue instructions for the repair of the panels to proceed. Initial costings amount to £45,000 plus VAT, but the quoted figures could increase considerably once the repair work is underway. In addition there will be a final bill for removing the scaffolding and for church cleaning and organ dust removal. In summary the total costs of the project are expected to exceed £100,000

#### 12 Related Charity

The administration of the Church is undertaken from the Ranmoor Parish Centre at 5 Ranmoor Park Road, Sheffield S10 3GX. The Ranmoor Parish Centre Trust (charity No. 511649) is a related charity, its objects being the furtherance of the religious and other charitable work of the Church of England in the ecclesiastical parish of St John the Evangelist, Ranmoor in the Diocese and City of Sheffield. The Vicar, Churchwardens and representative members of the PCC are also Trustees of the Ranmoor Parish Centre Trust.

In the year the Parish Centre was paid £6,500 (2016 - £6,500) in respect of the Church's use of the facilities. There were no amounts outstanding at the beginning or end of the financial year.

#### 13 Sale of Ranmoor Parish Hall

Funds from the sale of the Parish Hall, are held by the Ranmoor Church Hall Trust whose trustees are the vicar and churchwardens with the Diocesan Board of Finance acting as a custodian trustee. The Deposit fund stood at £319,678 at 31st December 2017 (2016 £350,828).

#### 14 Agency Collections

During the year agency collections has been used to record sums received for other staff/organisations, eg. Wedding payments for organist, verger, bellringers, Diocese of Sheffield etc.
