# Objectives and activities

The pupose of the charity is to:

Promote, for the benefit of the residents of Gamesley and the surrounding areas, the preservation of good health by providing healthy and affordable meals in the interests of social welfare and with the objective of improving the conditions of life of those persons in need, and

Provide, or assist in the provision of, facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have the need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the objective of improving their lives.

# Delivering public benefit, achievements and performance

Our cafe premises provide a focal point for the wider community and an inclusive meeting place, with an open-door policy, for people of all ages. We support various initiatives to enhance the quality of life in the neighbourhood and work in conjunction with other bodies and agencies. We are working with the Police Safer Neighbourhood Team to help vulnerable members of the community and improve relationships with youth and young children. We have strong links with with the Community Mental Health Team working with them to provide a safe place for people with mental illness. Drug and alcohol services also work with us to help people address addictions and we have links with various rehabs.

Currently three groups meet weekly in the cafe during the afternoons comprising; a seniors' group, a craft group and a children's music workshop.

We offer nutritious meals to those living on the margins. We have strengthened our links with High Peak Community Housing and have been working closely with their officers regarding homelessness. We provide volunteering opportunities for local people which have led to employment opportunities. Currently we have 15 regular volunteers drawn from local churches and the community of Gamesley. We also provide work experience placements for local secondary schools, including a space for children to meet with tutors on a one-to-one basis for revision and extra tuition in a non-threatening environment.

In conjunction with three agencies providing volunteering placements, the cafe is providing volunteering opportunities for those with learning difficulties. We have a few people now working with us, some supported by carers. These are life changing placements for those considered to be unemployable, raising their self-esteem and increasing confidence and communication skills.

## Financial review

Total income for the year to 31 March 2018 was £69,622, of which £48,342 was contributed by the cafe operations. Donations amounted to £21,280, which included £5,083 from Charlesworth Independent Chapel. Although costs rose by a little over 2%, we were able to produce a surplus of £3,364.

#### Principal funding sources

In addition to the income generated by the cafe, the charity's principal funding arises from voluntary giving by individuals who support the aims and objectives of the charity in the form of ad-hoc donations and committed monthly support. Ongoing support is also provided by High Peak Borough Council and occasional grants or donations from charitable or corporate bodies.

# Reserves policy

Our aim is to maintain a level of reserves sufficient to meet our financial and statutory obligations as and when they occur. Retained reserves amounted to £15,394 at the year end, which we regard as sufficient to enable us to continue and further develop our present level of operations.

## **Future plans**

More recently the Derbyshire Alcohol Advice Service has been working very closely with us. We have been able to offer some of its clients access to Rehabilitation Centres. This partnership is growing and is of benefit to the local community. This partnership offers the DAS another outlet for the placement of its clients and has been warmly welcomed by all concerned. We have been working closely with High Peak Community Arts which is providing music and drama workshops for 8 to 13 year-olds throughout the summer, culminating in a summer school and two productions; one in Gamesley and another in Buxton. The team feel that the cafe is a safe central space for working with young people.

We have now been linked with a local supermarket which provides us with fresh fruit, vegetables and other food products on four days each week. This enables us to use fresh vegetables and fruit to make meals and to keep our costs down.

We continue to offer advice and assist people in debt to get help and support. We are supporters of the local Credit Union. On the fourth Sunday of each month we have Cafe Church where people are provided with brunch and children and adults can meet. This also helps to link in with the the religious education part of the local schools' curriculum. People attending generally do not attend traditional church.

We have now been operating the cafe for twelve years and its place has been cemented in the community it serves. We hope to improve our kitchen facilities in the very near future and look forward with anticipation and hope to increase our activities over the next twelve months.

## Structure, governance and management

#### Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 11 March 2008, registered as a charity on 20 August 2009 and commenced activities on 1 September 2009, taking over the operation of the Gamesley Community Cafe.

The company was founded under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company, and is governed in accordance with its Articles of Association. Membership of the company is open to individuals or organisations who are members of the participating churches in the company and/or users of Cafe Jericho; apply to the charity in the form required by the directors; and are approved by the directors.

In the event of the company being wound up each member is required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

# Appointment and retirement of trustees

The directors of the company are also trustees for the purposes of charity law. Under the provisions of the Articles of Association, directors must be aged 18 years or older and must number not less than 5. A person may be appointed to serve as a director provided they are willing so to act and have been proposed in the manner set out in the Articles. One director shall be the Minister in charge of one of the churches participating in the work or support of the charity and at least two others (or the majority, where the total number of directors exceeds 5) shall be members of the participating churches.

At each general meeting one-third of the directors, or the number nearest to one-third, must retire from office by rotation. A director retiring by rotation is eligible for re-election.

## Organisational structure

The company is governed by a board of directors which meets regularly during each financial year and is responsible for policy making, strategy and supervising the operational activities undertaken by the cafe staff and volunteers. Management of day to day activities is devolved to the staff and volunteers.

# Risk management

The directors have established policies and systems to mitigate risk, both financially and operationally, and these are reviewed on a regular basis to ensure they still meet the requirements of the company.

## **Declarations**

The company has taken advantage of the small companies' exemption in preparing the report above.

## 1 Basis of preparation

## 1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared as a going concern under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102 SORP) published on 16 July 2014 and with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and with the Charities Act 2011.

## 2 Accounting policies

#### 2.1 Income

## Recognition of income

Income is include in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

#### Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses.

#### Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general recognition criteria are met.

#### Legacies

Legacies are included in the SoFA when receipt is probable, i.e, when there has been grant of probate, the executors have established that there are sufficient assets in the estate and any conditions attached to the legacy are either within the control of the charity or have been met.

## Tax reclaims on donations

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation.

#### Donated facilities

Donated facilities are included in the SoFA when received at the value of the gift to the charity where that value can be measured reliably. The donated facilities are recognised as income with an equivalent amount recognised as an expense under the appropriate heading in the SoFA.

#### Volunteer help

The value of volunteer help is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustee's annual report.

## 2.2 Expenditure and liabilities

#### Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

## Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulations and good practice.

## Redundancy costs

No redundancy payments were made by the charity during the year.

#### Deferred income

No items of deferred income have been included in the accounts.

#### Creditors

Where applicable, creditors are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts.

## Provision for liabilities

A liability is measured on recognition at its historical cost and then subsequently at the best
