The focus of our activities remains hosting regular art and craft exhibitions, drop-in art classes, workshop and talks. All of our exhibitions are free and we encourage groups to visit, especially local schools.

## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

#### **Exhibition Programme**

During this year we have held a very respectable 11 exhibitions. We started in April with a solo exhibition 'Weathered Landscapes' showing large scale paintings and ceramics by Paul Redfern. Oxfordshire Artweeks followed and at the gallery we took the concept of Trilogy and asked our contributing artists to submit 3 related works using their own theme. During this exhibition we welcomed children from our local primary school who spent an hour or so sketching what they had seen.

In June we worked with The Heartstone Fund who used the gallery along with local gardens for an excellent sculpture focused exhibition. We were especially pleased to be supporting them as their fund mentors young people making the transition to professional artists. Another solo exhibition followed in July with Abstract Paintings by JB Lowe.

Our very successful Contemporary Craft Exhibition was held in August where once again we sought out high quality local artists to represent a large variety of crafts. Twice a year we hand our exhibition space over to our members and in September we presented An Observation of Blue which explored their perception of blue in a variety of hues and materials.

Five Oxford Artists came together in 'Natural Flow' during October each with their own approach to capturing the natural world, we enjoyed sculpture, drawing, painting and photography. During the early part of November we gave over a week to hosting Christmas Craft Workshops where participants made cards, decorations and gifts. Our final event of the year was our Christmas Craft Fair where our very talented members offered a wide range of art and craft suitable for Christmas gifts.

In January we held our Annual Art Sale where bargains could be found along with postcard sized works of art. Our 2<sup>nd</sup> members exhibition followed where we celebrated Music, Movement and Dance. Our final exhibition of the year hosted six photographers each showing their interpretation of the 'Urban' landscape.

#### **Events**

During the year we have run drop-in life drawing, still life and craft sessions and held several art related talks.

#### Gallery Maintenance

A good start was made this year on upgrading the Gallery, in January we gave the entrance stairwell a make-over in bright welcoming colours. With a very timely grant from the Bampton Community Shop we were able to replace the ageing and failing night storage heaters with efficient new heaters.

#### IT

Our IT systems were completely over hauled with the purchase of a new iMac computer and implementation of G-suite providing cloud based document storage and email this software was free being donated from Google via their not for profit programme. This has made a significant improvement on the behind the scenes running of the organisation.
