  - 3. Highlighting the roles of infectious agents in chronic multi-systemic illnesses in both human and animals.
- 4. Raising awareness within the medical profession of the ever increasing body of evidence that supports the theories of seronegative diseases, chronic persistent infection, and the effectiveness of extended treatment regimes.
