Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The advancement of education particularly but not exclusively, providing free out of school tuition to primary school pupils from low income families.

AlM runs weekly out of school tutoring classes for children from low income families. These classes are primarily focused on helping the children prepare for the 11+ Kent Test, which is the selection test for Grammar school places in Kent.

During school holidays, the frequency and length of classes is increased

Children are selected for AIM on the basis of income and academic suitability. Places are only given to children from low income families.

AIM classes:

- Familiarise the children with the process and requirements of the Kent Test
- Raise the children's educational aspirations and build their confidence

Section D Achievements and performance AIM ran weekly Kent Test preparation classes between January and Summary of the main September 2017. During the summer holidays, (July and August 2017), achievements of the charity additional classes were run in preparation for the test in early September during the year 2017. AIM also supplied learning support online, giving the children access to Bondonline tuition. AIM also provided the children with two motivational trips during the year; a trip to the cinema and an outing to Bowles Outdoor Centre, which offers outdoor activities to boost learning. - AIM classes were attended by 10 children in 2017 - All 10 children sat the test in September 2017. Of these 6 passed and were selected for Grammar School places in Kent. The trustees successfully applied for grants and private donations in this period and were successful in securing £5,500, which has been carried forward for the 2018 programme.

The charity aims to secure sufficient funding through applying for grants in order to continue the programme for a new cohort in the next financial year.

The AIM financial year runs from January to December, which covers the time each cohort of beneficiaries is on the AIM programme. Each cohort is a different group of beneficiaries. A cohort is not recruited until funds are in place to complete the AIM programme for them.
