Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Biggleswade and District Scout Council held on 27th April 2016 at Boyd Field District Headquarters.

- The Chairman asked that the minutes of the last AGM be read, as there were no amendments, the minutes were signed as a correct record. Proposed D. Bridges, Sec. D. Whiddett. These were approved and carried.
- Presentation of the Annual Report by District Chairman Peter Cheney. He read through his report.
- 5. The acting District Commissioner Jan Brooker commented on the DC Report. The first part was written by Gerry Pope the retiring District Commissioner owing to ill health, Jan then carried it on for the rest of the year. Proposed by John Hilditch, sec. by Ken Brooker.

Haynes and Wilstead now have a small Explorer Unit and are looking to increase this over the coming year and incorporating the Young Leader scheme.

We must not forget the incredible success of Biggjam, which was also a celebration of 50 years of the Campsite and Activity Centre at Boyd Field. I was delighted, at the campfire, to present the wardens with the Chief Scouts Commendation for Service to Scouting. Well done to them both for this achievement outstanding achievement.

From my own perspective we have strengthened the District Team with the appointment of Tracey Gardner as the ADC Beavers and Neil Ludlow at ADC Scout, I wish them well with their District programmes in the future.

We have also appointed Matt Panton as our Network Commissioner and after a slow start he is now working well with the 18-25 section to support scouting throughout the District. Thanks Matt.

The Badge Shop and Scout Shop continue to flourish and we thank all the team for giving up their time on a Tuesday evening to provide uniforms, certificates and badges to the Adults and Young People in the District. This is a very useful form of revenue for us so their support is very much appreciated. Thank you.

Before I say a brief word about 2017, I would like to thank absolutely every leader, assistant leader, executive member and supporter of Scouting throughout Biggleswade and District, we could not run such a successful district without your continued input in providing and supporting challenging, fun and safe scouting for all.

To finish I would just like to look briefly at 2017 and what we can look forward to.

We have a new Troop opening up at Henlow/Clifton, they will be using the Boyd Field facilities and will run on the same night as the current Troop, good luck to them.

We are hoping to plan a recruitment session to reopen the Gamlingay and Gransden Beaver Colony, we have the Regional Development Team helping us with this recruitment.

During the latter part of 2017 some of our young people will be asked to apply for a place on the World Jamboree Team for 2019 which is being held in North America.

We have the District Beaver camp 1-2nd July with over 250 beavers camping at the Boyd Field, a fantastic achievement for so many young people to experience.

There is also the District Cub Camp, and loads of other District events for all sections. Please encourage all the young people and adults alike to come along and enjoy the fun.

There will no doubt be many more exciting things to look forward to, but if I told you them all there would be no surprises.

Biggleswade & District Scout Council Chairman's Report

As can be seen from the other accompanying reports, 2016 was another successful year for the District in Scouting terms for activities offered by the District and the constituent Scout Groups. There were the usual District wide events for the various sections ranging from a Teddy Bear Pick Nik to the grueling weekend Hike.

The District Exec's primary role is to oversee the finances of the district including the Groups that make up the district and the assets of the district itself. Financially the district is in good health which has enabled us to make donations to new sections being started in the groups and to support District events. The biggest of these by far last year was Big Jam which was fortunate to enjoy good organization, good weather (mostly) which led to everyone having a great time. Many thanks go to the organizing team and to all of the helpers over the weekend.

The largest asset that the Exec oversees is the Boyd Field Memorial Camp Site, it is also the biggest income creator and cost center as keeping this beautiful facility in pristine condition is a task akin to painting the Eiffel Tower. The small but dedicated team that look after the site do an amazing job but there are limits to what can be maintained and improved under the current way of working; so next year I will be reporting on how well a substantial change in the management of the site has settled in. Hopefully over the course of the next several years, and it will take years, everyone will see an improvement in the facilities on the site and an improved experience for the users of the site as the team running the site expands.

Not everything goes according to plan a case in point is the requirement to upload reports and a statement of accounts to the Charities Commission. Over the past few years this process has been an annual job carried out with little to note, however 2016 was to prove the exception. The accounts for the year ending 31 December 2015 were prepared and forwarded to our auditor in April 2016, nothing exceptional there. The accounts were distributed at the 2016 AGM with little of note other than the comment that although the accounts were with the auditor nothing had been heard of since delivery.

This state of affairs continued until September when with the approaching deadline for submission to the Charities Commission (31st October 2016), attempts to establish the whereabouts and status of our accounts at the auditors were made. Eventually with less than a week before the deadline, the accounts were returned to us without an auditor's report, but with the statement that the accounts were £1 out.

The explanation that the paper accounts were rounded to the nearest \pounds as is usual practice, and that the accompanying USB stick and spreadsheet could be examined to the penny, fell on deaf ears.

I contacted the Charities Commission in line with their advice uploaded the report and accounts then set about discussing the situation with our new auditor as confirmed at the 2016 AGM. It was agreed that the best course of action was to submit the 2015 and 2016 accounts to the auditor as soon as possible in the New Year.

There were two reminders from the Charities Commission that we were in default but both communications ended with a statement to the effect that there should be a plan in effect to regularize the situation as soon as possible.

I am pleased to report that the 2015 accounts (and Spreadsheets) were scrutinized by our new Auditor and found to be in order; a statement to this effect was signed off allowing me to re-upload the reports and accounts to the Charities Commission, so we are now compliant.

Further, the auditor has also reviewed the 2016 accounts, found them to be in order and has issued the compliance certificate, which you will find in the AGM Accounts paperwork available to you today. Presuming a successful AGM the documents will be uploaded to the Charities Commission web site within the week.

I look forward to the next year with optimism, that we will continue to thrive as a District, and that the changes recently put in place for the management of the Boyd field will start show results for the benefit of all.

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Independent Examiners Report to the Trustees on the unaudited Financial Statements of Biggleswade and District Scout Council.

I report on the accounts of the Biggleswade and District Scout Council for the 12 month period ended 31st December 2016.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

As the charity's Trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the Accounts, you consider that the audit requirement of section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply. It is my responsibility to state on the basis of procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under Section 43(7)(b) of the Act, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeking explanation from you as Trustees concerning such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the Accounts.

Independent Examiner's statement.

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:-
