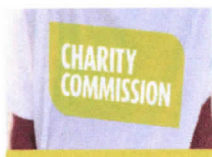
English Springer Spaniel Welfare

The prevention of maltreatment and cruelty to English Springer Spaniels and in particular to encourage responsible ownership of English Springer Spaniels throughout Great Britain

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

In 2017 ESSW took 184 English Springer Spaniels into their care, who had either been surrendered by their owners or held in council care having been found straying. This was an increase of 14 on the total number of dogs taken into ESSW care in the previous year. Of those dogs, 9 were euthanised, prior to rehoming as they were deemed too ill or aggressive to rehome.

ESSW continued to award lifetime veterinary sponsorship to dogs who require it due to advanced age or specific medical requirements.

ESSW continued to pay £50 towards the cost of castration for all 'entire' dogs that have been rehomed by us – neutering is specified in the ESSW rehoming contract that every new owner's signs. All entire bitches are spayed prior to rehoming by ESSW. Dogs not micro-chipped are done so by ESSW prior to rehoming.

Additionally, ESSW continued to maintain and support its website which gives behavioural and care advice specific to the needs of English Springer Spaniels.

ESSW trustees have paid due regard to Charity Commission guidance on public benefit in deciding what activities the charity should undertake

ESSW have over 100 volunteers (although they might not always be active during certain periods), willing to give their time to help with home and dog assessments which helps enormously with the work load being under taken by Area Coordinators (also volunteers).

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

ESSW are proud of the number of dogs they have helped during 2017 – many of these dogs would almost certainly have been put to sleep if ESSW were not able to assist in the rehabilitation and rehoming.

However, ESSW have also been able to manage situations effectively where it has been in the best interests of the dog to put to sleep for its own welfare reasons. The alternative for some of these dogs would be a life of exclusion due to behavioural traits or a life of pain due to medical issues and age. Thankfully these occasions continue to be rare.

It is also satisfying for ESSW to know that they have been able to give good advice and assistance to dog owners which has enabled them to work through issues with their English Springer Spaniel and continue a successful and happy relationship with their dog.
