- The Parish Church of St Peter and St Paul Rustington is a separate charity, a related party to the Rustington Parish Church Humphrey Bequest. During the year £ 260,000.00 was transferred to the PCC of Rustington Re ordering Account.
- 4 The funds are held in an account with Schroder & Co Ltd trading as Cazenove Capital Management. In addition, a small current account is maintainted in The Vicar and Churchwardens General Account with the National Westminster Bank plc.
- The Trustees have been advised by the managing agents, Marshall Clark LLP that as at 31 December 2016, sums are due from the tenants, in respect of Rent, Buildings Insurance and maintenance.
 £10,852.05 of rent, insurance and maintenance was subsequently received on 25th January 2017.
- 6 The properties at 2,4,6,8 &10 Sea Lane Rustington were valued by the Inland Revenue on the death of Mr Humphrey in 1983. No further valuations have been obtained.
