INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY

FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S INSTITUTES

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31. December 2017, which are set out on pages 4 to 8.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2016.

b Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:

c Stock

Stock consists of goods held for resale which are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

d Voluntary Income

All voluntary income, legacies and grants are utilised within the general unrestricted fund for the furtherance of the principal activity of the company, except that where a particular use of any amount received has been specified at the time of receipt, a restricted fund will operate. Any such specified use should be compatible with the objects of the company and capable of execution by the company.

e Fund Accounting

- (I) The company's General Reserve consists of unrestricted funds which the company may use for its purposes at its discretion.
- (ii) The Property Maintenance Reserve has been created to specifically accommodate amounts set aside for future maintenance costs. It is an unrestricted, but designated fund of the company.
- (iii) The restricted funds are those where donations have been received or fund raising events have been held for specific purposes.

f Pension Costs and Other Post-Retirement Benefits

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the company's pension scheme are charged to profit or loss in the period to which they relate.

9 CONNECTED PERSONS AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The company exists to promote the interests of Womens Institutes throughout Bedfordshire and as such ensures that the membership of the W.I. both as individuals and collectively benefit from its normal operation.

Employment costs are as shown in the detailed income and expenditure account, in addition to which the company enjoys a considerable amount of voluntary effort by the officers, directors and members. The value of these donated services has not been quantified and is not reflected in the accounts.

Subject to the foregoing there were no material related party transactions during the year.

Looking back over the past eventful year it has been hard to remember all of what has happened in the Federation. There has been a change in the office after our County Secretary left in August to go on to pastures new and we welcomed Nicola Furey in October to take on this role. We have also had a change in County Chairman and Treasurer and said goodbye to a long standing member of the Board who has served us extremely well over the years and hope she will now be able to take things a little easier.

All the Sub Committees have worked exceptionally hard to arrange varied and interesting programmes, thank you so much, and to you the members for your continued support of Federation Events. May I also express my sincere thanks to the catering committee, who have worked tirelessly to prepare meals for the Burns Night Supper, the 4 nights at the Murder Mystery plays, the Shoe Sale and the Denman Day lunches, Wine Tasting Evening and prepared teas and lunches for the Flitwick Cricket Team and their opponents, (I hope I haven't forgotten anything, so apologies if I have!), well done.

Gyles Brandreth proved to be a popular choice for 'Our Afternoon With', an excellent speaker, I am sure he would have gone on all afternoon and into the evening if we had let him. The Faith Tour, as in previous years was oversubscribed and so was the talk on the Jewish Way of Life. John Rutter Christmas Concert was the best concert I have seen and we also had 50 tickets for the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra's 'Best of Broadway' at the Royal Albert Hall in March which was a sell-out.

The more energetic few raised monies for The British Heart Foundation, the Federation and your own Wi's on an extremely hot Sunday Morning at the beginning of June. This sponsored walk was the last one being held at the Forest Centre, Marston Moreteyne. The two Treasurer Hunts, this year held in Potton are still as popular as ever, finding villages we have not visited before with the necessary facilities is proving more and more difficult. Padded Boxes Classes, Beginners Crochet Classes, Jigsaw Evening, Millionaire, and various coach trips are a few of the events you have enjoyed and supported.

A first for the County was a promotional stand at the Bedford River Festival, and of course on one of the hottest days of the year, two coaches went to Hampton Court Flower Show where our Centenary Rose the 'Bedfordshire Beauty' was launched in the Rose Pavilion. It certainly lived up to its name, a pale yellow rose with a very delicate perfume.

A Denman Day Visit with a cookery demonstration was organised, the coach being subsidised by the monies raised from cricket teas, enabled 50 members to go to visit Denman, many for the very first time. 69 members came on our Federation Weekend in June 2017 which was another fantastic success. Just to keep you informed The Bedfordshire Room at Denman has been decorated and has new curtains and a quilt with the chair soon to be replaced. Grateful thanks for your support of our 'Save Denman Appeal' you raised in excess of £15,000 by the events you organised, the Smartie Tube Challenge or by just sending in donations. I understand monies are still trickling in. The final figure at the end of the national appeal was in excess of £650,000 and still rising. A Sponsored Bicycle Ride was Diane's way of raising monies, on International Women's Day, for this very worthy cause.

Welcome to our two newest WI's, Biggleswade Evening and Elstow, may they prosper and enjoy the ethos of the WI for many years to come.

Finally, may I thank the office staff of Nicola Furey, Sue Watson and Sue Oliver for all their hard work, help and support over the last year, without them the production of the County Handbook, organising of certain events and day to day administration would not be possible. I would also like to thank the Board of Trustees, the Sub Committee members and anyone else who have helped in any way for all the support they have given me and my predecessor over the past year, it is very much appreciated.
