As a young boy he went for a week to Portobello, only a few miles from Edinburgh which has a lovely sandy beach. When he was a little older he spent time in late August on a farm in Boat of Garten helping with the harvest. It was not until he was 14 or 15 years old that he ventured south to Morecambe in Lancashire and he was before making his first trip abroad – France. He praised the work that SFHF did for young children and families from disadvantaged backgrounds and presented the Chairman with a cheque for £300 from Abbeyle Rotaray Club, of which he has been a member for many years.

Rachel Hopkins proposed that she be re-elected and this was seconded by Stephen Allen.
