A Review of the Year

This year has seen the volunteers excel themselves with the creation of more outstanding exhibitions. It has also been an Award Winning year, with the collections and exhibitions team beating 13 other candidates in their group to scoop the Share Museums East Volunteers Award. Dave Armitage and John Woolston were invited to the ceremony at The Museum of Anglian Life in Stowmarket.

Then in September, the Town Council awarded the founders of the Museum a Community Award each for all their hard work in creating and sustaining a lasting heritage of Elstree and Borehamwood. The recipients were Mary Hanson, Ann and Alan Lawrence and Florrie Cowley.

Museum Manager Dave Armitage has been on the radio again, promoting the Museum to the 3 Counties audience and there have been many visits to the Museum from schools and the Girl Guides throughout the year.

The Museum is working towards Full Accreditation under the Arts Council Scheme in the summer of 2018.

The monthly reminiscence session continues to be popular and the volunteers have worked hard to devise interesting and entertaining themes for this free session. Subjects this year have included: Ghosts, Holidays, Industry, Music and Mystery photos.

Exhibitions

From Village to Town: January 2017 to July 2017

Eighteen months of behind the scenes work finally came to fruition with the opening of this exhibition. So many people had contributed, the Museum had to hold two private views!

Dave Armitage and John Woolston spent hours converting telephones into audio posts so that snippets of the many interviews conducted by Project Officer Matt Caro could be listened to. John also spent a great deal of time editing a film of more interviews with background archive footage of Borehamwood through the ages.

Toys, Games and Gadgets: July 2017 to January 2018

This was a great success with children and big kids (adults!) alike. Toys, Games and Gadgets from the 1970s onwards were covered in this exhibition with a selection of hands-on authentic games to play again. Pong, Game Boy, Simon, Computer Perfection were just some of the toys to be fathomed out and remembered. Heaps of nostalgia and lots of fun.

Events

The Museum's **Annual History Walk** led by Dave Armitage again, began at Stirling Corner and continued through to Woodcock Hill where the walkers discovered the Beacon, the Napoleonic Signal, and the crater from the VE1 that fell on Borehamwood in 1945. From there, the route crossed back across Furzehill past the Three Ways Centre and back down via the old RNLI building. Dave related many tales of how Boreham Wood was at the start of the last century, and how much the area had changed from farms to houses. Three miles in three hours and much history was absorbed.

As part of the Toys, Games and Gadgets exhibition, the Museum held a **Games Evening** on a cold night in November 2017. Despite the weather, a good crowd turned out to play as many games as possible in two hours. On offer were the old fashioned favourites such as Conkers, Jacks and Marbles to Table Football, Jenga and Tiddlywinks. Good fun was had by all and thanks to Helen Stamp for organising.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice:

Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and with the Charities Act 2011.

Recognition of income

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, it is more likely than not the trustees will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general income recognition criteria are met.

Income from membership subscriptions

Membership subscriptions received in the nature of a gift are recognised in Donations and Legacies. Membership subscriptions which gives a member the right to buy services or other benefits are recognised as income earned from the provision of goods and services as income from charitable activities.

Income from interest

This is included in the accounts when receipt is probable and the amount receivable can be measured reliably.

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

Stocks

Goods provided as part of a charitable activity are measured at net realisable value based on the service potential provided by items of stock.

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Provisions for liabilities

A liability is measured on recognition at its historical cost and then subsequently measured at the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the reporting date
