Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

The Charity has continued with its range of Saturday morning and Holiday Club activities. Feedback from parents and children indicates high levels of satisfaction and enjoyment. Families and carers continue to be very appreciative of both the facilities offered by the Charity and the respite opportunities that the Saturday and Holiday Clubs allow.

During 2017 the Charity had to reduce its Saturday morning activities due to staffing difficulties, but we still managed to provide cinema visits, pantomime visits, swimming and other sport related activities, cooking sessions and visits to animal sanctuaries. Average attendance was between 5 and 6 children and young people supported by an average of 5 staff and a Manager per session.

The Charity was able to provide successful holiday programmes of activities, one week during the Easter break and two weeks during the Summer break. These programmes were very well supported with up to 20 children attending with very positive feedback from parents and carers.

We plan to continue these Saturday and Holiday Club activities into next year subject to adequate funding being available.
