Administrative Information

The Parish church of St. Peter & St Paul is situated on Sheep Street next to the Market Place, Kettering. It is part of the Diocese of Peterborough within the Church of England. The correspondence address is The Rectory, Church Walk, Kettering.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is a registered charity with the Charity Commission in England under the name "The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Peter and St Paul, Kettering" with registration number 1135658.

Structure, Governance and Management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

Objectives and Activities

The PCC of St Peter & St Paul has the responsibility of co-operating with the incumbent, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It has maintenance responsibilities for the Parish Rooms, The Market Place, Kettering. The trustees acknowledge that the charity complies with section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 regarding providing a public benefit.

Achievements and Performance

Church attendance

Last year our electoral roll stood at 272. For this year, a net increase in the roll of 14 leads to a total of 286.

Review of the year

The PCC has met seven times during the year, the business of the meetings discussing a wide range of issues.

The main objective the PCC has undertaken during 2017 was to establish a vision for the future and work towards establishing an action plan to enact this vision. During 2017 it was agreed that our priorities as St Peter & St Paul are as follows.

Inspired by the love of God and a vision of new life, we commit ourselves to

- · helping Kettering rediscover its heart and soul
- tackling loneliness and isolation in our community
- nurturing Christian faith and discipleship
- being welcoming, hospitable and inclusive
- providing a spiritual home for young families

In addition to working towards an action plan for this vision the PCC has:

- Reviewed the parish safeguarding policy.
- Approved the licencing of Rev Carys Walsh as an assistant priest.
- Made appointments for positions of Stewardship Officer, Deputy Verger and Gifts & Talents Officer.
- Approved the appointment of a parish intern for 2018.
- Established a school admissions policy in relation to applications for Bishop Stopford School.
- Established a Communications Team.
- Approved the recruitment and training of a Pastoral Visiting Team.
- Established a project to celebrate 800 years of Rectors in Kettering.

The parish soup kitchen continues to grow and now supports 40-45 guests per week.

The grounds and buildings sub-committee has continued its work to manage any maintenance and repairs to the church buildings during the year.

St Michael and All Angels has been working to build an action plan based around a vision with the following three priorities:

- -working towards developing engaged work with our young people who are rising through teens into their young adult hood.
- -thinking about how a daytime group for people who are lonely, or elderly could be resourced,
- -and considering how we can shape some of the parts of the service to ring the changes in the church year, build up our music making, and grow the creative talent of the whole congregation in contributing to our worship

In addition to these items of business, the PCC continued to monitor the work of St Michaels DCC, the Grounds & Buildings and Finance & Stewardship Committees, and to do its best to make sure that parish life continued to grow and flourish.

Financial Review

Total receipts on ordinary unrestricted funds were £164,620 and are detailed in the Financial Statements. This includes £20,597 recovered by Gift Aid.

Total expenditure of ordinary unrestricted funds were £172,836 with the largest single item being the Parish Share at £88,804.

The net result of ordinary unrestricted funds for the year was a deficit of receipts over payments of £8,216. After adding bank and deposit balances brought forward at the beginning of the year, the balances carried forward at 31st December for unrestricted funds totalled £77,822.

Reserves Policy

It is PCC policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), which equates to approximately six months unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The balance of £77,822 on unrestricted funds at the year-end exceeds this target.

The balance of £12,393 held in restricted funds. £7,172 is retained in the Fabric Fund towards the ongoing cost of maintaining the church buildings.

It is our policy to invest our funds balances with the CBF Church of England Deposit Fund.

Independent Examiner

Independent Examiner's Report
