Mission statement

AFFCAD UK's aim is to fundraise for projects implemented by Action for Fundamental Change and Development (AFFCAD) in Uganda. AFFCAD UK raises awareness of the problems faced and the solutions available to empower communities in less developed countries.

Activities in 2017

2017 was an incredibly busy year for AFFCAD UK. We saw a range of exciting events including Miss Uganda UK's 'Celebrate to Donate' (celebration of Ugandan talent in London), new school partnerships such as Dulwich College and GEMS Cambridge International School, and celebrated the success of our first London Marathon runner. It was also a year of interaction between the UK and Uganda, with our first school trip taking place at Easter, all of the UK team visiting Bwaise and even one of the AFFCAD Uganda founders visiting the UK.

One of the main focal points in 2017 was a summer campaign called **Bus2Bwaise**. James Allen's Girls' School (JAGS) kindly donated a school minibus to the AFFCAD team for use at their school and vocational training centre in Uganda. It was AFFCAD UK's job spray paint an AFFCAD inspired design on the bus and to ship it from London to Kampala. This campaign was hugely popular on social media, with regular updates on the journey of the bus keeping followers gripped.

Alongside this, AFFCAD UK invited supporters to join our team of volunteers to complete a challenging fundraiser - **the Four Peaks Challenge**—this resulted in raising a substantial amount towards Excel Rebuild, which along with a generous donation towards shipping from Hyperoptic, ensured the project ran smoothly. The team climbed 3 Peaks in Yorkshire and then travelled out to Uganda for the first AFFCAD UK-Uganda team building event. Together both teams climbed the 4th peak in Sipi Falls and spent time sharing good practice and learning from each other.

Once the bus had been safely received in Uganda, things did not slow down for AFFCAD UK as we officially launched our fundraising campaign for AFFCAD's largest project to date – the Excel School Rebuild (Excel Rebuild).

Excel Rebuild was implemented after AFFCAD faced increasing rent costs and more and more maintenance issues with the current school. The project was deemed essential in helping AFFCAD continue to deliver quality education to children in the largest and most deprived slum in Kampala, Uganda: Bwaise.

September saw the launch of an amazing new website for both AFFCAD and AFFCAD UK bringing the 2 organisations together with clear branding in the AFFCAD colours and a great platform for Excel Rebuild. Huge thank you to Natalie from the AFFCAD UK team for the work completed on this.

The UK team kicked things off with a Santa Run and a Christmas Card Campaign in December – both of which were successful in raising vital funds for the school whilst also raising awareness of the project. A school Santa Run especially for Excel Rebuild also took place in Dulwich Park with James Allen's Prep School (JAPS).

The Excel Rebuild is expected to be fully complete in 2024 and fundraising for this will be an ongoing priority for AFFCAD UK until completion.



AFFCAD UK wrapped up 2017 with a most successful Christmas parcel campaign, partnering with a new school St Saviours and St Olave's School (SSSO). Over 200 Christmas presents arrived for children in Bwaise who enjoyed a Christmas party funded by AFFCAD UK and finishing the year in style!

Outlook for 2018

The focus for 2018 will continue to be on Excel Rebuild and supporting the team in Uganda as much as possible with this. As this project is on a much larger scale than previous fundraisers, AFFCAD UK are aware of the need to get additional funds and will ensure grant applications are a top priority for team members to work on.

In addition to this, AFFCAD UK are aware of the amount of work required by all in the team and are looking for additional core members to join the voluntary team, as well as additional trustees in order to diversify the knowledge on the Board.

Public Benefit

The trustees consider that the objectives and aims stated above of the charity provide public benefit within the meaning and terms of the Charities Act 2011.

Reserves Policy

AFFCAD UK does not have a minimum fund to be held in reserves – all money raised will be contributed towards charitable activities as detailed in the constitution document.

All trustees are appointed in accordance with section 10 of AFFCAD UK's 2017 constitution and meet the following criteria:

- (1) Apart from the first charity trustees, every trustee must be appointed for a term of three years by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.
- (2) In selecting individuals for appointment as charity trustees, the charity trustees must have regard to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the CIO.

The organisation uses known contacts and individuals with an interest in Ugandan development as well as recruitment website services (Reach Volunteering and Southwark Volunteer Centre) to recruit Trustees and volunteers.

When new trustees are appointed they are given a formal induction into the work of the organisation. All trustees and volunteers are given a copy of the latest Constitution and Organisation Chart.



Any decision by the charity may be taken either: at a meeting of the charity trustees; or by resolution in writing or electronic form agreed by all of the charity trustees, which may comprise either a single document or several documents containing the text of the resolution in like form to each of which one or more charity trustees has signified their agreement.

- (a) No decision shall be taken at a meeting unless a quorum is present at the time when the decision is taken. The quorum is three charity trustees, or the number nearest to one third of the total number of charity trustees, whichever is greater, or such larger number as the charity trustees may decide from time to time. A charity trustee shall not be counted in the quorum present when any decision is made about a matter upon which he or she is not entitled to vote.
- (b) Questions arising at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of those eligible to vote.
- (c) In the case of an equality of votes, the person who chairs the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
