Trustees' Report

Small company provisions

This report has been prepared in accordance with the small companies' regime under the Companies Act 2006.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

CDMT is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 6 December 1999 and registered as a charity on 28 January 2000.

It is established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of CDMT and is governed by its Articles of Association.

The number of directors (who act as trustees) shall be at least fourteen and not exceed sixteen and each shall be appointed for a three year term of office. One third of the directors must retire at each Annual General Meeting. CDMT is a membership organisation governed by the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees delegates specialist responsibility to the Conference of Professional Schools and the Awarding Organisations Committee. Each committee meets four times a year to address issues relevant to its constituency and in turn reports back to the Board of Trustees. A wide ranging programme of initiatives and projects is formulated in consultation with the membership which is designed to meet identified needs. Day to day operational management of CDMT is under the authority of the Director, a full time salaried officer.

RISK MANAGEMENT

CDMT has considered the major risks to which it is exposed and has reviewed these risks and established systems and procedures to manage them. A risk assessment is conducted annually to review the major risks faced by CDMT and to ensure that the Board of Trustees (acting as directors of the charitable company) have a sound knowledge of the charity and are in an informed position regarding its operations.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of CDMT is to advance the education of all persons and principally children, young people and students in the art, practice and appreciation of the cultural significance of dance, drama and musical theatre and to promote high standards in their education and training in those performing arts.

In summary, CDMT:

- Accredits excellent professional training at full-time dance, drama and musical theatre schools, providing the industry benchmark since 1979
- Validates the world's leading awarding organisations which offer dance, musical theatre and performing arts qualifications
- Works with **Affiliates and collaborative bodies** to develop the highest standards of programme provision across the performing arts
- Recognises, by means of the Recognised Awards scheme, pre-vocational performing arts schools and teachers
- Provides membership and other specialist services through the Conference of Professional Schools, Awarding Organisations Committee, Steering Group for the Dance and Drama Awards, Affiliate meetings, Graded Examinations Forum and Higher Education Forum

- Negotiates with government authorities on issues of education funding, policy and regulation
- Manages a substantial public-facing online platform <u>cdmt.org.uk</u> which promotes members and services, and administers two information websites for DaDA <u>dadainfo.org.uk</u> and Graded Examinations <u>gradedexams.com</u> respectively
- Publishes the **UK Guide** which is the definitive resource for those seeking information on quality provision in the sector
- Operates a **free comprehensive guidance service** for students, parents, teachers, artists and employers.

EXPENDITURE POLICY

Annual Budgets for all aspects of work and responsibility are agreed by the Honorary Treasurer and the Director and submitted to the Board of Trustees for comment and approval prior to the commencement of each financial year. Significant amendments to agreed budgets during a financial year are discussed by the Honorary Treasurer and Director in the first instance and then presented to the Board for comment and approval or otherwise.

Annual report

As the industry body offering quality assurance and membership services to institutions delivering training, education and assessment in dance, drama and musical theatre, an adjustment of the company name from the CDET to the Council for Dance, Drama and Musical Theatre (CDMT) was formally announced at the House of Lords, London on Thursday 22nd March 2018.

At the start of the organisation's fortieth year, the launch highlighted the significant roles of industry accreditation and validation in securing the voice of employers, sector bodies, and teachers in the design and delivery of professional training and qualifications respectively. Both quality assurance processes promote outstanding industry-approved institutions which allow prospective students, candidates and their parents to better understand what constitutes excellent provision in dance, drama and musical theatre, as well as informing sector professionals and government education authorities in their work.

The CDMT:

- Ensures the consistent application of standards across professional schools and awarding organisations, better complementing the breadth of disciplines offered by performing arts' providers
- o Advocates powerfully on behalf of members, increasing their public profile and influence with key industry and political stakeholders
- o Acts as an authoritative source of information on high quality provision across the sector.

Through providing a UK-wide forum in which authorities, educators and employers can collectively discuss common concerns and work strategically to deliver vital aims, the organisation also strives to ensure that specialist training is complemented by both strong advancement pathways at the earlier stages of learning and by valued development opportunities for proficient individuals going forward in their careers.

Our membership presently comprises 30 Accredited schools, 16 Validated awarding organisations and 11 Affiliates, with growing interest from others. The dedication of these institutions to excellence in dance, drama and musical theatre is inspirational, as is their shared commitment to the advancement of outstanding artistic performance. In support of this work, updated membership logos for the CDMT have been circulated, underlining the relevant kite mark of distinction.

Accredited schools: We ensure the provision of high quality professional dance, drama and musical theatre training through the accreditation of full-time performing arts schools. Accreditation is only awarded to those schools and colleges that have successfully undertaken a thorough and comprehensive institutional-level review by a panel of nominated industry experts.

<u>Validated awarding organisations</u>: We validate many of the world's leading awarding organisations offering graded, vocational and diploma examinations in dance, musical theatre and the performing arts, ensuring excellence in examination provision by carrying out quality assurance inspections and annual comparability studies of assessment standards.

<u>Affiliates</u>: Affiliates are committed to working with us to develop the highest standards in their scrutinised courses. Some programmes focus on progression towards a specific role in the performing arts such as access provision, whilst others encourage reflective practice in a workbased context, including continuing professional development.

Membership services are coordinated through the Conference of Professional Schools, Awarding Organisations Committee and Affiliate meetings, with particular efforts expended on influencing key funding and policy initiatives driven by government departments. We also interact closely with bodies such as DfE, DDCMS, FAB, HESA, Ofsted, Ofqual, QAA and UCAS. For example:

Steering Group for the Dance and Drama Awards (DaDA): We coordinate communications between the Education and Skills Funding Agency and schools delivering courses within the scheme, along with developing briefing papers for government ministers and administering the DaDA information website dadainfo.org.uk.

During the past year we have, in support of our membership, progressed a number of specialist sector reports, including shared initiatives across Validated awarding organisations and collaborative bodies with the purpose of providing an authoritative source of information for government agencies when dealing with matters affecting the recognition of graded examinations across the performing arts. For example:

<u>Graded Examinations Forum</u>: We facilitate cooperation across all Ofqual recognised bodies which award graded examinations in dance, drama, music and musical theatre. Projects to date include the booklet *Graded Exams*: *The Definitive Guide*, its associated website <u>gradedexams.com</u> and numerous papers addressing regulatory issues.

The Recognised Awards scheme continues to attract influential backing, making valuable contributions to the development of safe and professional standards of practice in pre-vocational learning settings, with associated teachers holding specialist teaching diplomas in dance, drama, musical theatre and music.

In November 2017, the organisation's fourth Careers Conference took place at the Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts, disseminating up to date guidance on funding and training opportunities to prospective students and their parents/carers. The next Conference involving students, parents and teachers will take place at the Urdang Academy, London on 25th November 2018, culminating in a showcase performance by students of Accredited schools at The Shaw Theatre, Euston.

We would particularly like to thank Spotlight for continued sponsorship of our UK Guide to professional training, education and assessment in the performing arts for which a special edition has been produced in 2018. As ever, our main website cdmt.org.uk is the primary source of up to date information about high quality provision. The site offers many opportunities to promote members' activities.

Further, our electronic newsletters promote developing ventures as they arise—alongside publications, leaflets and social media outlets—and the online calendar features performances and open days at Accredited schools. Staff respond to telephone and email queries on a regular basis to ensure that reliable information is readily available to authorities, media and the general public alike.

We are presently in the process of co-ordinating the establishment an All Party Parliamentary Group in Performing Arts Education and Training with the CDMT acting as the secretariat. The aim is to support parliamentarians in discussions relating to:

- o appropriate training, education, assessment and professional practices across the performing arts, particularly drama, dance and musical theatre
- o practitioners continuing professional development within the creative and cultural industries
- o wider benefits of engagement with the performing arts for students, practitioners and audiences.

CDMT members make an enormous contribution to the sustainability and international profile of the UK creative industries, a contribution we support and celebrate.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The year to 28 February 2018 has again been successful operationally and financially. The financial statements show a net surplus for the year of £19,519 (2017 £21,453). This surplus has been due to a combination of increased income and savings made through ongoing efficiencies.

RESERVES POLICY

CDMT's reserves at 28 February 2018 stood at £190,637, which represents 7.5 months' income.

The Trustees' aim is to establish reserves to a level which could support the organisation through a period of financial and operational uncertainty.

CDMT has a stable operating model and this, along with a good medium-term planning horizon and long-term commitments from a number of key stakeholders, mitigates these risks. However risks still persist, and over the next four years, the Trustees are targeting a free reserve of £250k to underpin activities. This level has been arrived at following consideration of a range of potential operational risks, including income generation from current activities, operational cost risk and a contingency allowance.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The trustees are required by company law to prepare financial statements for each financial year which gives a true and fair view of the financial activities of the charity and its financial position at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements the trustees are required to:

- a) Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- b) Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) State whether the policies adopted are in accordance with the companies Act 2006 and with applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- d) Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is appropriate to assume the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the asset of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Council for Dance, Drama and Musical Theatre (formerly Council for Dance Education and Training)

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 28 February 2018, which are set out on pages 9 to 15.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 28 February 2018

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 15.

Incoming resources

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract.

Grants are included in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable. They are categorised as restricted where the donor wishes to restrict their use more narrowly than the general purposes of the charity.

Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £0 or more are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:

13. Members' liability
