# Building futures

## Changing lives

There is nothing quite like the gratitude of an elderly cataract patient who can finally see his grandchildren, or the joy of a relieved mother cradling her new-born baby.

### Our vision

The core objective of the Hashim Welfare Hospital Appeal (HWAHA) is to provide high quality, accessible health-care, with a focus on the poor and needy. Our aim is to achieve this through our core project; The Hashim Welfare Hospital in Pakistan.

### Facing the challenge

There are about one and a half million people in Pakistan who are blind or visually impaired because of cataracts. Maternal mortality due to complications in labour and childbirth is 178 deaths per 100,000 births. The under-five mortality rate is 81 deaths out of a thousand, and there is an almost 25% probability of dying from preventable and treatable diseases such as diabetes and heart disease.

### Hashim Welfare Hospital

The Hospital is a combined project of two charities, and was founded in the UK by Dr Idrees Awan. HWAHA is based in the UK and the Hashim Welfare Association (HWA) is on the ground in Pakistan. The foundation stone for the Hospital was laid on 9 April 1999 in Pindi Hashim, a rural village between Islamabad and Lahore.

The development of a country is based upon the quality of its health-care, education, and protection of the vulnerable. With the help of our staff, volunteers, and supporters we can continue to help more people access quality healthcare, change lives, and build healthy futures for all.



# Chairman's message

In July 2018, it will be 15 years since we saw our first patient at Hashim Welfare Hospital (HWH).

In that time, we have achieved great milestones in our efforts to provide accessible health-care in rural Pakistan. We began construction of HWH in 1999 with £10,000 and high hopes. Looking back, it is still a surprise to me that to date we have spent about £140,000 on our current buildings and yet we have managed to treat over 650,000 patients.

## **Achievements**

The eye department continues to perform well. We started maternity services in 2011 in response to the dire issue of pregnancy and labour related deaths. Since 2016, we have been working alongside our German partners, PAKISTAN-Hilfe zur Selbsthilfe e.V. The team has helped provide screening for hearing disabilities as well as hearing aids, and training for our staff.

## **Building futures appeal**

The Hospital reached full capacity some time ago with patients and families waiting outside during busy periods. To meet these challenges, the current buildings need to be extended. We

have prepared ourselves for this difficult task through detailed discussions with architects, builders, and experts from our charity partners. The new extension plan is in four sections and includes; ground and first-floor in-patient wards, a diagnostics and theatre block, and an outpatients block with an auditorium. The total cost will be approximately £500,000.

We held our first fundraising event on 11 February in Woking. There was a magnificent response at short notice; we managed to raise £111,000. With the generous help of Woking Borough Council, we managed to secure a favourable rate for the venue, allowing us to maximise donations. We hope to make this a yearly event.

## **Transparency**

We are continuing to improve contact with donors to keep them informed about the work of the charity. We hope to continue this by being more active through the website and other media. In Pakistan, HWH has been registered

with Punjab Healthcare Commission, and Pakistan Inland Revenue Service and Tax Department.

## **Thank you**

We would like to thank our honoured guests at last year's AGM, held at the H G Wells conference Centre in Woking; The Mayor of Woking, Cllr Graham Cundy, Jonathan Lord MP, and Zahid Choudary, the deputy high commissioner of Pakistan.

Finally, I thank Almighty God for His continued blessings. None of this could have been achieved without the support of our families and friends, donors, colleagues, HWH hospital staffs, and Hans Joachim Gerber and his team at PAKISTAN-Hilfe zur Selbsthilfe e.V.

# Departments and clinics

15 years ago, we started with five part-time staff, a small out-patient clinic, and a dispensary. Last year we had 45 staff members, and eight clinical departments, with more planned.

There are a number of essential supportive departments including finance and cleaning and security. Our infrastructure is ready to support a 32, and later a 64 bed hospital after completion of the new extension.

## General medical, and surgical

The general medical, and surgical department has the biggest work-load at HWH. The hospital is in a rural area and there is no medical referral system in Pakistan, so we see all types of patients. The department is headed by a consultant surgeon, supported by three medical officers. Clinical staff can access medical advice from consultants from the UK through Dr Awan.

## Ophthalmology

This was our first specialised department and has grown steadily in the past 15 years. We have two consultant eye surgeons, and two weekly eye clinics and theatre sessions. The bulk of clinical work is related to cataract and associated conditions. Cataract surgery is mainly performed with foldable intra-ocular lenses with the option of extra-

capsular surgery. Laser for post-cataract surgery is available and we are planning to provide prescription lenses and glasses in the future.

## Maternity

The maternity department includes neonatal, paediatrics and gynaecology. We currently employ two consultant gynaecologists during regular hours, and a consultant surgeon on-call. Specialised pre-natal, child welfare, and family planning clinics are being considered for the future.

## Diagnostics

This is one of our busiest departments because many doctors from other clinics and hospitals send their patients for tests. This department is supervised by Professor Nasir Iqbal from Lahore. We are in discussions with Dr Adnan Aali from the UK, to supervise a new infection control programme at HWH.

### **Hearing disabilities camps**

Since 2016, our charity partners Pakistan-Helpz zar Selbthelb v z have been conducting ear camps at HWH. So far, the team has examined 788 patients and fitted 169 hearing aids. They have also been training our staff and will be assisting HWH in developing a new ENT department.

### **Future departments**


#### **ENT**

The ENT clinic will be housed in the new extension and we will appoint a consultant ENT surgeon to lead the department under supervision of Professor Dr Safdar Nawaz Malik from Islamabad. We are receiving extensive advice and guidance from PHzS.

#### **Urology and renal dialysis**

The urology and renal dialysis department will be housed in the new extension. We are fortunate that our chairman is a consultant urological surgeon currently working in the NHS. We are in discussions with senior urologists from Pakistan and the UK.

Mohammad Yousef is from the village Sabore and is a mechanic in Saudi Arabia. He was finding work difficult due to the cataract in his right eye. Mohammad was not insured and couldn't afford care in Saudi Arabia.

He asked his sister Bushra to recommend a good hospital in Pakistan. A couple of months earlier she had an operation to remove a cataract at Hashim Welfare Hospital and was very pleased with the service she received. Mohammad returned home and had his operation at HWH.



Karim was overjoyed with the results, which have given him a new lease of life. He heard about HWH from people in his village and now he wants to share his experiences with family and friends.


# HWA Pakistan & PHzS Germany

We are continuing to plan a ENT department in the new extension, with particular focus on early years hearing disability screening, and treatment.

PAKISTAN-Hilfe zur Selbsthilfe (PHzS) are also assisting in a clinical waste management programme. The team helped us to separate recyclable waste so it can be sold on the market to benefit the Hospital. The chairman of PHzS, Mr Hans Joachim Gerber, along with Michael Christian, a qualified electrician from Germany, visited HWH and are involved in helping us in designing, planning, and construction. Dr Awan and Mr Gerber are visiting again in July to begin finalising the revised extension plan design.

## **Pakistan AGM and budget meeting**

The Annual General Meeting and Annual Budget Meeting are conducted routinely with local donors and donors from the UK. The Annual General Meeting was attended by members of PHzS.




