Churchwarden Report 2017

St Francis'

This past year has presented us with challenges but also excitement that God is ever present and working his purpose out here at St Francis.

In March 2017 after much planning and enthusiasm by many members of the congregation we launched Explore Together. This is an all age, inclusive monthly event. Although not particularly well attended, we have not allowed this to disappoint us. We have grown together spiritually and as a team working together so maybe this is God's purpose for us at the moment. The Explore Together Christingle, however was very well received and the craft zone very busy with Christingle making. We would like to thank all who take part organising the music, the technology and preparing the material.

Scramblers saw a big change in leadership last year with the departure of several volunteers who had run the group for some time. Whilst we are grateful to those who gave their time to run this group we saw this as an opportunity to bring scramblers back into the body of the church as it had been the intention when it was started in the 1990s. We have all these young families entering our building four days a week, so it became apparent that it is God's will that we reach out to them by building relationships and showing them love and support. It is with this in mind that we would employ as the next scramblers leader a Christian who would be able to lead on this. We were delighted when Annie Tyas was appointed and can already see a calming, more spiritual presence at scramblers. We are getting to know these families, building relationships, offering to pray for them, running parenting courses and First Aid courses and play and pray is happening on a Thursday.

Unfortunately, we lost a much-loved former member of the congregation during the year – Lucy Hunt. Lucy had been a Sunday school teacher for many years. As she very kindly left a legacy to St. Francis it was with her love of children in mind that we organised a working party after a great team building exercise at Ikea to turn the corner by the font into a safe environment for babies, toddlers and children. This is not quite complete and is a work in progress but there are plans for a further working party to complete the corner.

During the summer of 2017 there was a working party to clear the brambles at the side of the church. This project known locally as Phil's big dig was good fun and again showed how we are able to work as a team. We are grateful to Dave and Phil for organising this.

We took part in several missional events during the year -

The Bristol South Deanery walk for Christian Aid, praying for the areas as we walked and enjoying great fellowship and hospitality.

The Arts Trail.

The Lantern Parade – hosting a lantern workshop for the community in the St Francis Centre and providing free tea and coffee on the drive of the rectory. We thank Andrew and Kate for allowing us to do this.

North St. Fayre – being a presence on North St. speaking to people and generally showing them that we care.

Upfest – YWAM were on the lawn and several people came to faith as a result of conversations with them.

Bereavement Service – This took place in January where we invited relatives of the recently departed whose funerals we had been involved with or who were known to us personally. This was well received, and we offered prayer, refreshments and the chance to talk if required.

We would love to do more but at this moment in time we do not have the resources so are just concentrating on a few things, trying to do them well. We pray that if we are patient and it is God's will we will be provided with the gift of more people to help.

Bible Study continues to take place regularly. It is good fun, there is great fellowship as we discuss the Bible and although some of the stories are familiar to us it is exciting to see them in a different way. No question is too trivial, and it is exciting to hear how each of us view things differently.

We have faced a difficult and challenging time this year with the complaint against Andrew by six members of St. Aldhelm's congregation. However, with much prayer, intervention from God and love and support from the St. Francis family we have all come through this. We are extremely grateful to the St. Francis family for their love and support of Andrew, Kate and family during the difficult time. You showed real compassion and love. We thank all those who worked hard to keep the church going whilst we may have been a little distracted with statements, meetings and reports that took a lot of time. We continue to pray for St. Aldhelm's congregation, that they will have the appropriate ministerial support and that Andrew will be provided with the appropriate role to complement his ministry here at St. Francis in order to use the gifts and talents he has been given by God.

We do not know what the year ahead will bring but we are confident that this church will continue to thrive and be a welcoming, caring, peaceful place where God is ever present for many years to come.

Many other people helped out, including Andrew Doarks who carried off a masterful performance of the fiendishly difficult piano accompaniment. The performance and the animal mask workshop before it were a great success and very enjoyable.

Thanks to Zoe Ireland and Juliet Wynne for coordinating the rest of the Arts Trail weekend. After many years of faithful service to our church Mike and Liz Turner left in May. We miss their enthusiasm and energy.

Also, we said goodbye to Jean Uren, who passed away on 4th June. Her funeral on 22nd June was memorable for the wicker casket, the angelic singing of all three Turner girls, Andrew's heartfelt 'this is not a eulogy because Jean didn't want one' recollection of her life,

the refreshments provided by her family and finally, singing the casket out of the building for Jean's final journey to a woodland burial.

After receiving a formal complaint from six of the parishioners against Rev Andrew Doarks, Bishop Lee Rayfield, acting Bishop of Bristol, concluded that '...... for Andrew's wellbeing, and that of the church, it would be best if Andrew voluntarily relinquished his role as Priest-in-Charge of St Aldhelm's. Andrew himself understands and supports the need for this and I want to make clear that this is not a result of any disciplinary action.' The Bishop's statement was read out in church on 12th November by our Area Dean, Rev Canon Nick Hay.

From September to November, while Bishop Lee was considering the complaint, he expected Andrew to find other people to take services and meetings at St Aldhelm's. Rev Sue Gent asked Nick Hay's permission, which he gave, for her to preside at communion two Sundays a month. My sincere thanks to Sue, who only joined our congregation in October 2016 and works full time as a tutor at Trinity College, for taking on this role in a voluntary capacity. Thanks also to the team of lay people who preach and lead services for their willingness to take on more engagements in the latter four months of the year and to Edward Huxley, who took on the roles of keeping the rota up to date, building us a new website and producing publicity materials including posters and the new sign for the outside noticeboard.

12th November was also our Remembrance Service, when we welcomed the uniformed youth organisations back to St Aldhelm's. Their presence boosted our congregation to 120 people. The leaders were very pleased to be invited and we hope to see them back in 2018.

Messy Christingle on 8th December was attended by 75 children and 45 adults and was enjoyed by all who attended. Thanks to Rachel Ireland and her team for all the hard work that went in to it.

The next Wednesday, 13th December, was our Carol Service. My thanks to Sue Gent for her participation in organising, leading and preaching. Thanks also to Belinda Clarke for rehearsing the choir and conducting and to James Baker our guest organist, who adapted to the 'Hauptwerk' sampled sound pipe organ with great flare, the cold weather proving to be too much for our real pipe organ.

The Crib Service and Christmas Day services also went well I am told. I include below, with her permission, Sue Gent's posting on 'facebook' dated 26th December which lists many more ways people ministered during that time. My thanks to all those people as well.

'St Aldhelms are amazing! From messy Christingle to the carol service then the crib service and Christmas Day (not to mention the services in between) I saw people using their gifts and working together as the body of Christ to celebrate Jesus birth and proclaim good news to others. Fantastic services and a great welcome given to others in Jesus name! Visitors were saying how glad they were they had come and what a great church. Everyone played their part (including the visitor who played the piano on Christmas Day at the last minute!). Folk just got on doing flowers and the advent wreath, readings, prayers, serving coffee, welcoming, sorting and delivering publicity and website, preaching, leading the children, leading services, caring for others, praying, leading singing, rehearsing, playing musical instruments, planning admin, doing fire assessment, putting candles up and decorating the church, assembling the tree and crib, sorting money and records, preparing for communion, bringing mince pies and preparing mulled wine and much more behind the scenes. This is every member ministry at its best!! So great to share with the St Francis folk too on Christmas Eve morning- they are a great team and it was lovely to see them with us! I am so grateful to God for you all.'

George Turner does a huge amount of work behind the scenes for St Aldhelm's in his roles as caretaker, bookings manager and treasurer. As the time of vacancy began he also took on liaising with Nick Hay about banns, baptism, wedding and funeral enquiries. My heartfelt thanks to him. In addition George and Anne together run the Toddler Group three mornings a week, with numbers attending and contributions to church funds rising through the year.
